The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their second and final teleconference meeting of April. The first order of business was the public hearing and the second and final reading of Ordinance 2020-01 which concerned extending the temporary Moratorium on Medical Marijuana. The temporary moratorium was extended another six months to September 1, 2020.

The next item was the first reading on Ordinance 2020-03 which concerned amending Chapter 42 Article II Culverts. This concerning ordinance amends and Chapter modernizes 42 Streets, Sidewalks and other Public Places; Article II Culverts, amending Section 42-31 permits required for installation; and amending Section 42-33 Pipe Size. The ordinance was approved. The public hearing and second reading will be Thursday, May 7 at 7 p.m.

The next item was a recommendation by the Planning & Zoning Board for a lot split for Ben Buchanan. Land Use Administrator Janis Fleet advised the council that all the proper paperwork had been filed and the property separated into two parcels. The property is on Oxford Street and meets the zoning district lot size requirements and has water and sewer accessible. The council approved the recommendation.

The council accepted the resignation of Planning and Zoning Board Vice-Chair Glenn Higginbotham.

The Planning & Zoning Board along with Town Clerk Lisa Purvis recommended appointing Hilliard resident Dallis Hunter to fill the vacancy on the P/Z Board.

"I don't have a problem with Mr. Hunter being on the P/Z Board but I would like to suggest that we advertise that we have an opening," said Councilwoman Callie Kay Bishop. "There may be a Hilliard resident that would like to serve in this capacity if they had the opportunity."

"We normally just choose who is nominated," said Purvis. "Mr. Hunter is a member of the Volunteer Fire Department, he is very active in his church and he is active in youth sports. I've also talked with him and he has said he would like to serve on the board."

Council President Beasley made a motion to accept the appointment of Mr. Hunter. Councilman Kenny Sims seconded. The appointment passed by a vote of 4-1 with Bishop voting no. "Again, I have nothing against Mr. Hunter. I just thought advertising might be an option," added Bishop.

Land Use Administrator Janis Fleet advised the council of her quarterly report which included: Worked with the

developers attorney on the Whisper

Ridge PUD; attended a joint workshop concerning the Franklin project on US 1 and reviewed the traffic study; and met with developers on potential projects; and signed off on building permits, an average of 5 to 6 a week.

Code Enforcement Office

Del Miley advised the council of his quarterly report which included: 9 miscellaneous; 1 building permit; 3 pool permits pending; 1 pool permit completed; 1 abandon vehicle; 1 land use completed (excavation/filling); 1 inspection or tree debris removal; and 1 citation for business license renewal.

Public Works Director Ritchie Rowe requested approval of a capital purchase of 20 loads of asphalt millings at a cost of \$450 per load. "This should be enough to finish all the remaining streets in the town with millings," said Rowe. The council approved the request.

Councilman Lee Pickett requested approval to use the town parking lot for a Chicken Dinner Giveaway on Saturday, April 25. "The group Hilliard's Helping Hands would like to give away 1,000 chicken dinners to families in need," said Pickett. "They came to me for permission and I think it's a great idea. It would be a drive-thru giveaway where the people would stay in their cars and the dinners would be given through the vehicle window. We can probably direct them from the back (like we do the clean-up) straight up the parking lot and out on Pine Street. We could also use some volunteers."

The council approved the request.

The next meeting will be Thursday, May 7 at 7 p.m.



Callahan Approves Zoning Change

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night by teleconference for their final meeting of April. The first order of business was the second and final reading and approval of Ordinance 2020-O02 which concerned a small scale amendment to the Comprehensive Plan. The ordinance will designate the future land use of certain real property containing 1.91 acres currently described as Mixed Use to Commercial Highway future land use. The property is located on State Road 200 directly across from the Post Office.

The next agenda item was first reading on the much discussed ordinance concerning changes to the town charter. After some discussion and a motion with amended language, the council approved Ordinance 2020-O06 with language changes. This ordinance concerns making the mayor an office held by a council member and chosen by the council and hiring a Town Manager for administrative duties. The charter change would also make the Town Clerk an employee of the town versus an elected position. All these changes must be made by holding a referendum for the amendment and placed on the ballot.

The following item concerned the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan. Each council member had a copy of the plan prior to the meeting. The council approved the plan.

Town Manager Mike Williams advised the council, three bids had been received for paving five more roads within the town. The bids were All Pro Asphalt, \$84,955; Duval Asphalt, \$104,425; and FL Infrastructure, \$97,600. Williams recommended All Pro Asphalt at a cost of \$84,955. The council approved the recommendation.

The council received a proposal from Meridian Waste concerning disaster preparedness debris cleanup. As hurricane season is coming up, this was a contract of the services Meridian will provide during a disaster within the town limits. The council approved the proposal.

In closing comments, Mayor Fontes advised the council that at this time, the town will still host the National Day of Prayer on Thursday, May 7. We hope to have it attended and not virtual however as things change daily, you all will be updated so plans can be finalized.

The next council meeting will be Monday, May 4 at 7 p.m.


