The 1st Annual Nassau County Strawberry Festival will begin this Friday, April 26 at the Northeast Florida Fairgrounds. The festival will feature lots of rides for all ages, games, traditional carnival food, and of course strawberry food items. There will be strawberry shortcake, strawberry tacos, strawberry ice cream, strawberry funnel cakes, milkshakes and much more. There will also be a baking contest for homemade pies and desserts with strawberries as the main ingredient. To enter the baking contest, call 904-504-9519.

The festival kicks off this Friday, April 26 at 5 p.m. through Sunday, May 12 at the NE FL Fairgrounds. Admission is \$10 per person (ages 14+); Youth (ages 13 & under) \$5 per person; and 24" height & under get in free. THREE-PEAT! Conner is **Three-Time State Champion**

For the third year in a row, Hilliard Middle-Senior High School's Colton Conner is the Weightlifting State Champion in the Traditional 139 class. This past Saturday, Conner became the only male in Nassau County to win 3 state titles in the Florida High School Athletic Association's 1A state contest. He benched 295 pounds; and clean and jerked 230 pounds for a total of 525 pounds, and the state title.

Colton is a very humble, dedicated and calculated athlete. During last year's

championship, he competed with a fractured wrist. He noticed pain one month before the competition, but pushed through thinking it wasn't a serious injury. He followed the 2023 season with surgery to correct the fracture and a few minor setbacks that kept him out of

football for his senior year. He did not let it get him down; he used the time to train for the third state title he was searching for. Colton, 19, has competed in the same weight class for the past three years. This is very impressive and can be difficult to do as a growing teen boy especially while gaining muscle weight. With a goal in mind, Colton followed his strict diet of mostly chicken, fish, rice and lots of milk, lifted daily and would run nightly to stay in his weight class.

Confederate Memorial Day Observed

In the state of Florida, April 26 is designated as Confederate Memorial Day. Local camps of the Sons of Confederate Veterans will hold observances throughout the confederation. The observance is also known as Confederate Heroes Day and Confederate Decoration Day.

The first observance occurred April 26, 1866, when the Ladies Memorial Association of Columbus, Georgia

passed a resolution to set aside one day annually to memorialize the Confederate war dead. These ladies penned letters to the Ladies Associations in every former Confederate state to join them in this observance. The date of April 26 was chosen

by Elizabeth Rutherford Ellis, as the anniversary of Confederate General Johnston's surrender. In observance, fresh flowers were to be scattered on the graves of the Southern war dead. This was simply referred to as "Memorial Day." Confederate was not added






until two years later in 1868 when the organization for former Union soldiers picked up on this example from the Southern ladies and in 1882 adopted the name "Memorial Day."

The citizen-soldiers who fought for the Confederacy personified the best qualities of America. The tenacity with which they fought underscored their belief in the rights guaranteed by the Constitution. These attributes

are the underpinning of our democratic society and represent the foundation on which this nation was built.

Kirby-Smith Camp 1209 held a Confederate Memorial Day Service Saturday, April 20 in Old City Cemetery in Jacksonville. The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans and the oldest hereditary organization for male descendants of Confederate soldiers, sailors and marines. Organized in Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 years is preserved. Hilliard Town News

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of April. The first order of business was a Public Hearing and First Reading on Ordinance 2024-02. The ordinance concerns Amending Chapter 62 Zoning and Land Development Regulations of the Hilliard Town Code; Section 62-1 - definitions; Amending Section 62-36 - Notice of Public Hearings; Amending Section 62-281 – Zoning District Regulations; adding Section 62-386 -Wireless Telecommunication Facilities. The council approved the Ordinance on First Reading. Final Reading and Public Hearing was set for June 6, 2024.

The next order of business was the council's approval to adopt Resolution 2024-09, to accept a Florida Department of Transportation offer of a Public Transportation amendment to the Public Transportation Grant Agreement for Environmental Assessment.

Parks Commissioner Joe Michaels advised the council the Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenburg was unable to attend but is requesting the council's approval to begin the seasonal staffing for the summer. The council approved the request.

In other business, the council approved payables for Project: IT Town Hall Park expansion in the amount of \$2,953.65. The council also approved payables to Mittaurer & Associates, Inc. for Project: FDEP PA0302 Oxford Street Force Main Rerouting in the amount of \$3,450.

In closing comments, Michael Roland, a resident of the Southern Pines subdivision, approached the podium to address the council. "I just want to say I've been trying to get my wife set-up here in Hilliard in her salon, rather than driving to Jacksonville," said Roland. "I feel like I have been shafted by the town. I've paid a permit of \$2,300 and we need to put two sinks in. Back to the town I went and was told it would be \$1,896 additional to add 2 sinks. It's not like she's going to have 15 chairs in the salon. I'm asking for direction about this problem. I can't seem to get anywhere."

In other comments, Mayor John Beasley reminded the council that it will be Food Truck Friday, August 26 from 4-8 p.m. at Town Hall Park.

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, May 2 at 7 p.m.

The Return to the Land

I Chronicles-Esther - As we are continuing our journey through the Old Testament, we will conclude the Historical books in this month's article. Last month, we considered the gift and the giving of the land of promise. The land of promise was given to Israel, but the land was not given in such a way that the nation of Israel was guaranteed to keep the land forever. If Israel was unfaithful to the covenant that they had entered into with God, they could lose the land. The books of I-II Kings, showed how and why Israel lost the land. Exile from the land was

the ultimate covenant curse. This followed the pattern of exile from paradise in Genesis 1-3. The God of the Bible is a faithful God. The God who promises curses for disobedience also promised to restore his people to their land. The last of the historical books show us how God makes good on his word to restore his people to the land of Promise.

- I-II Chronicles: The books of I-II Chronicles were originally one book in the Hebrew Bible. In the Hebrew Bible, the book of Chronicles was the last book in the Old Testament and was part of a group of books called the writings. The major difference between I-II Chronicles and I-II Kings is that author of Chronicles does not alternate between the kingdoms of Israel and Judah. The author's focus is only on Judah. Israel never returns from the Assyrian Exile in 722 BC. The Southern Kingdom of Judah does return back to the land of Promise after the Babylonian captivity was over. I-II Chronicles show us how God faithfully keeps his promise to restore his people under the administration a king from Judah. I Chronicles speaks of David's royal ancestry (1-9) and the reign of David (10-29). In II Chronicles, we see the construction of the temple (1-9) and the destruction of the temple (10-36). Within the chapters of the destruction of the temple we see the kingdom divided (10-13), the kingdom of Judah falls (14-36:21), and the restoration of the kingdom of Judah (36:22-36).
- Ezra/Nehemiah: Like the books of I-II Chronicles, Ezra and Nehemiah were originally one book in the Hebrew Bible. Both books give the history of the rebuilding of the Temple (Ezra) and the rebuilding of the city of Jerusalem (Nehemiah). Both books begin with brickand-mortar work and conclude with the work of rebuilding the lives of the people. In the book of Ezra, the temple is reconstructed (1-6) and the lives of the people are rebuilt (7-10). In the book of Nehemiah, the city of Jerusalem is reconstructed. Chapters 1-7 narrate the rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls and chapters 8-13 narrate the rebuilding the lives of Jerusalem's inhabitants.
- Esther: The book of Esther speaks of the existence of God's people who did not return to the land of promise. Esther and company stayed in Persia. They were exiles and strangers in hostile territory. The book of Esther reveals God's providence in preserving in his people outside of the land of promise. The book of Esther can be divided into two sections: Grave danger in chapters (1-4) and great deliverance (5-10).

With the close of the book of Esther, all of the History of the Old Testament has come to an end. The wisdom literature and prophets all fit within the historical books. The Historical books of the Bible show us that God's word can be trusted. God will aways do what he said he would do. The agent of deliverance is God. As these books conclude we see that the restoration that Judah experienced was partial, but real. The ultimate fulfillment of the promise of restoration will come through the Messiah. The Messiah is the Son of David, whose body/temple was destroyed and was raised three days later. As a result of the work of the Messiah, God's people will experience the renewal of all things in the resurrection. Paradise will not be lost forever.

Gardening Tips from Callahan Garden Club

Hummingbirds: Our fierce, feathered friends are back! They are fast, they eat a lot and the Florida Hummingbirds have returned. Up to 11 of the 16 species of hummingbirds found in the United States have been seen in Florida. However, you are most likely to see the ruby-throated hummingbird, as it is the only breeding hummingbird in Florida. If you have not put out your feeders, it is time to do so!

As you get your feeders ready, wash them with hot water and vinegar-avoid using soap or bleach. Prepare your own feeder solution with one part white, granulated cane sugar to four parts water. Boil the sugar solution to help dissolve the sugar and allow it to cool before filling the feeder. Change the solution every 3 to 5 days. Now place your feeder in a partially sunlit area, 5 to 6 feet from the ground, in an area with shrubs, bushes and native flowers. These provide perches and protection for the hummingbirds. Now, just sit back and watch the fun!



Lengthy Investigation Stops Lethal Drug Pipeline in Nassau County

Annette Elaine Jones, a 37-year-old from Jacksonville, has been sentenced to 10 years in federal prison for Trafficking substantial quantities of Methamphetamine and Fentanyl over the past two years. Over this period, Jones was involved in the distribution of 50 kilograms of methamphetamine and 5 kilograms of the highly potent opioid fentanyl.

The arrest on March 16, 2023, was the culmination of a lengthy two-year investigation conducted by a multiagency task force comprising the Nassau County Narcotics Task Force, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Through meticulous surveillance and controlled facilitated by undercover detectives at pre-determined locations Yulee, investigators gathered substantial evidence of Jones' drug Laboratory trafficking activities. analysis confirmed that the substances purchased during these transactions tested positive for methamphetamine and fentanyl.

In a statement, Nassau County



Sheriff Bill Leeper emphasized the collaborative efforts to combat dangerous drugs like fentanyl, saying, "As sheriff of this county, I can't stress enough that we are working diligently to get these dangerous drugs like fentanyl off the street. I'm happy to say we have another dangerous criminal behind bars who won't be able to kill any more people with this poison."

The successful investigation and prosecution of Annette Elaine Jones, demonstrates the unwavering commitment of law enforcement agencies to disrupt drug trafficking operations and hold accountable those who endanger communities by peddling deadly substances.


