Ewing Park Bathrooms Vandalized Again!

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting of April. The first item on the agenda was a proclamation read by Callahan Mayor Randy Knagge.

"This proclamation is to proclaim April Water Conservation Month in the Town of Callahan," said Knagge. The proclamation

included water is a necessity in everyday life; whereas, it's our duty to protect and conserve water usage; all businesses, schools and homes can do their part to conserve water; whereas April is a dry month and a good time to practice water conservation.

The next order of business was a presentation from Callahan resident Teneilia Anderson. "I wanted to tell this council about the Safe Haven Baby Box. We have all heard about babies being found in bathrooms, near garbage dumpsters, etc. The Safe Haven Baby Box is a way a troubled mother or father can place their baby in the special 'bassinet' box where the baby is safe," said Anderson. "The box must be placed at a fire station or hospital. The box is temperature controlled and once opened from the outside and closed cannot be opened again allowing the parent to walk away knowing the baby is safe. A silent alarm is sounded alerting the EMTs or paramedics that a baby is in the box. Within 5-10 minutes the baby is rescued and taken to a local hospital to make sure he or she is okay. I think this would be a great addition to our town. I have talked with Senator Aaron Bean and he has assured me that whatever we need he will help with it. The initial fee for the box is \$15,000 and I feel sure we (residents, businesses and friends) can raise the money."

"I would like to look



material a little further before I make a decision on this," said Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming.

"I also need more time to check out all the information," added Council President Ken Bass.

The final agenda item concerned the council approval of Ordinance 2024-O02 which concerned the voluntary annexation of .05 acres on Old Dixie Highway.

In closing comments, Town Clerk Shawna Gugliuzza advised the council that once again, the bathrooms at Ewing Park have been damaged in a horrible way. I am recommending that we lock the bathrooms at all times unless someone is having a party at the park and they notify Town Hall about the

"This is horrible and a true safety hazard. It's a shame that we have such a nice park and can't use the bathrooms because of destruction!" said Fleming. "I don't know what to do other than lock the park at night and open it back up in the morning.'

"I think that is what we are going to have to do right now until we come up with another option," continued Gugliuzza. At this time, the bathrooms will remain closed until repairs from the vandalism have been completed.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, April 15 at 7 p.m.







Budget is Not a Bad Word

Unfortunately, we are well acquainted with common ugly fourletter words. Fortunately, budget is not a bad six letter word, even though it has been given a bad rap. Poshmark, or any other avenue you have access to. If you are car poor and have a huge car payment that is eating up vour income, sell the car. Your income is your best wealth building tool. There was a time that I had to sell my 6-month new car, because it did not make sense for me to keep it while getting out of debt. I sold it and with the equity I had in it I bought a very used, but good car for me to use for that season of my life.

A user-friendly budgeting app called EveryDollar can be found at www. ramseysolutions.com. *EveryDollar* works well on your computer or cell phone. The free version is enough but if you need help tracking your transactions while spending, you can purchase the affordable version to keep you on budget. We all need budgets. Having a budget is the secret sauce to making your finances work!

Nearby, aluminum pieces lay scattered next to a truck, seemingly in the process of being loaded. Inside the vehicle, the deputy discovered several power tools.

As the investigation unfolded, the deputy spotted 44-year-old Albert Alex, emerging through the breached entrance gate. A second suspect, 40-year-old Blayne Buchanan, was also located on the premises. Both men showed signs of

handling the cut aluminum, with dusty metallic powder covering their clothing. When questioned, the pair claimed they had been hired to perform work at the hotel. However, upon contacting the property owner, the deputy learned that neither man had permission to be on site, let alone dismantle the premises.

Albert Alex and Blayne Buchanan, were both placed under arrest, facing charges of Burglary and Criminal Mischief causing over \$1,000 in damages, Theft for the stolen aluminum, valued between \$700 and \$5,000, and Possession of Burglary Tools.

A heated argument between a Yulee man and a victim escalated to gunfire on Wednesday afternoon, leaving the victim hospitalized with multiple gunshot wounds. Chad Jones, 32, is accused of shooting the victim after

a series of altercations. The incident unfolded when the Nassau County Sheriff's Office dispatch received a 9-1-1 call reporting that someone had been shot multiple times in the hip area. Deputies rushed to the scene, where they detained Jones and interviewed witnesses.

Witnesses stated that Jones and the victim had been involved in numerous altercations. As tensions reached a boiling point, Jones allegedly brandished a handgun and fired twice at the victim's back while they were walking away.

him with Attempted Second-Degree Murder. He was transported to the Nassau County Jail, where he awaits further legal proceedings. The victim, whose identity has not been released, was transported to a nearby hospital for treatment of their gunshot wounds.







NCSO Nabs Credit Card Skimmer

Sheriff Bill Leeper recently announced the arrest of 30-year-old Osiel Izquierdo Zambrano. The suspect, who is originally from Cuba, has been living in Jacksonville and traveled to Nassau County to commit this crime. On Tuesday, March 5, Nassau County Sheriff's Office detectives were called to the 7-Eleven at Lofton Square Court in Yulee, for reports of a skimming device installed on a pump.

Credit Card Skimmers are illegal devices that are normally covertly installed over legitimate payment terminals. The device is designed to read and store the information encoded on the magnetic strips of a credit card. They are designed to secretly capture the card data when an unsuspecting customer uses their card to make a payment.

A customer called 7-Eleven after witnessing two suspicious men tampering with one of the pumps. An employee walked out and noticed that one of the men sprayed a substance on the pump. When confronted, both men took off in a black Chrysler with Illinois tags. The 7-Eleven employee spotted the skimmer device installed over the original card reader.

NCSO deputies soon spotted the vehicle matching the description



on State Road 200, just east of US Highway 17. One of the deputies attempted to conduct a traffic stop however the vehicle failed to stop. The Chrysler was found abandoned near the intersection of Vegas Blvd and Venue Court. Both men took off running but Zambrano was found a short while later and placed into custody.

The suspect faces multiple charges including: Felony Fleeing and Eluding; Resisting Arrest Without Violence; Burglary to Unoccupied Dwelling; and Use of Scanning/Skim Device to Defraud.

The Nassau County Sheriff's Office is warning residents to carefully inspect credit card terminals, gas pumps, and ATMs before using them, and to immediately report any suspicious devices or tamping to law enforcement.
