





Busy Mom's Advice on Being Frugal

Activities, children, and snacks go together like peas and carrots! In preparation for the upcoming week, as you glance at the calendar you will see how many snacks are needed. For instance, two trips scheduled to the ballpark, two trips for dance classes, and one after school hair cut means that you will need five snacks. If you have multiple children traveling at the same time, then you multiple the activity times the number of kids you are chauffeuring.

Ways to save money while on the go:

- 1. Just say, "No to the convenience store." Keep Snacks and Drinks on Hand - My friend, Carrie Mizell, has a busy life that she organizes very well. Her frugal idea of pre-planning is to keep Little Debbie's and small bottles of water in a container in her SUV. This alleviates the expensive convenience store stop. For a mom with three kids this could easily be an \$18 stop each time. For three activities a week that is a whopping \$54. Great idea Carrie! Thanks for sharing it with us.
- 2. Dividing snacks The small bags of potato chips, container of 12 can be expensive. A money saving tip is to buy two large bags of potato chips and divide the chips into sandwich zip lock baggies. When I made my daughter's lunch every day, I would put five bags aside for her lunch. The other bags were her afternoon snack. Being on a tight budget, when the bags ran out, there were no more snacks for the week.
- 3. Baking your own snacks: A box of brownie mix, or a bag of cookie mix averages \$2. You can bake your snacks on Sunday for the upcoming week. (It will take discipline not to dive into them) Once they are cool divide them out and place in sandwich baggies for the upcoming week. Go ahead and put them in the car so they are ready for your first stop!



4. Reusable drink container: Dollar Tree sells small, plastic drink containers with a pop-up lid. Instead of buying drinks for snack time, these are a frugal option. Do not forget to fill them with your filtered water before leaving the house.

My daughter, Crystal, homeschooling mother of four children, told my mom, "Granny, my hands are full!" My mom told her, "Honey, better to be full than empty." Crystal said, "On days when I am overwhelmed, I hear granny's words and my perspective changes."

Give yourself permission to scale back on the extracurricular activities. Your kids will grow up not remembering the ballet classes or baseball games as much as they will remember how they were valued and loved. The Lord blesses us with them on borrowed time. Let us be mindful of how we fill our calendars. With each activity that you pencil in ask yourself, "Will this add to or take away from our family in any way?" May the Lord bless you as you balance work, raising children and the many hats you wear each day!





Hilliard Town News

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their first meeting of May. The first order of business was a presentation from Mr. Milton Locklear, representing the North Florida TPO (Transportation Planning Organization). Normally, the

TPO discusses any types of road improvements, pavings, etc. This presentation, however, was all about the Hilliard Airpark including: land purchase along Eastwood Road; Master Plan update (aviation capacity); new tractor and attachments; new hangars; construction of hangars; security fencing for newly acquired land; and construction and realignment of Pea

Farm Road beyond the runway.

The first order of business was to set a joint workshop with the council, Planning & Zoning Board and Land Use Administrator Janis Fleet. The workshop will be held Tuesday, May 24 at 6 p.m. The workshop will be held to review and discuss the proposed amendments to the Zoning and Land Development Regulations. The council was to receive a copy of the draft amendments Friday, May 6 to be able to look them over to be familiar with the amendments prior to the workshop.

In other business, Fleet advised the council that she needed direction concerning the installation of culverts without construction of a building. "Should they be questioned as what the culvert is for?" asked Fleet.

Councilman Lee Pickett responded, "I don't think we need to ask information. Some people want culverts all the way around their property. We don't need to know."

The council agreed with Pickett.

Fleet also questioned the council about Requiring Paved Streets in Previously Platted Subdivisions; and also about the process for approving Infrastructure Improvements for Development. The conversation between Fleet and the council continued for close to an hour before the council decided to table the items and discuss it in the upcoming workshop on

May 24

The following agenda item concerned Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenburg presenting an update regarding the progress of the department through March 2022. "The fitness center has had 4,055 visits; last year at this time, 3,142;

Individual members are 270; last year 236," said Whittenburg.
"There was a 69% increase in participation from the last winter sports season. After school revenue is up from last year; as is the Silver Sneakers from 410 attendance last year to 442 attendance this year."

Whittenburg also requested approval to start looking for seasonal Summer Temporary staff. The council approved the request.

The next item, Whittenburg requested approval to purchase new fitness equipment. "This is a budgeted item and we do have 3 quotes," said Whittenburg. "I recommend Strength Depot at a cost of \$9,461, which is under budget." The council approved the recommendation.

In other business, the council approved the payable for Dixon Tree and Lawn Service for mowing of Town Right of Ways in the amount of \$8,750.

The next agenda item, was also approved, which concerned paying Superior Design Pools & Spas, Inc. \$26,528 for the swimming pool marcite project on the town pool.

The final item concerned the company responsible for disposing of the Town's Class B biosolids. The company, H & H Inc. has handled the disposal for the town for some 14 years and they have had a price increase. The price was \$725 and will now be \$1,650 per 30-yard load. After discussion, the council approved the increase stating, "We have to have it."

Public Works Director Ritchie Rowe stated, "I will check to see if there are any other haulers, but we have had a great deal for many years."

The next town meeting will be held Thursday, May 19 at 7 p.m.
