#### Law Enforcement **Memorial Service Held**



- 4.) The American Soldier: Most Valuable Player of The Year


- 5.) "I am the way and the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

A few years ago, when Donna and I had the privilege to visit the Holy Lands, our tour bus stopped along the Northern Shore of the Sea of Galilee. They led us up on the side of the hill to a place that they claim was the place that Jesus sat down with the crowds, and shared the "Beatitudes." While we were sitting there we took time to read through that passage. Matthew 5:3-12, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for

they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. As different ones from the group took turns reading through this passage, I was soaking up all my eyes could see of the landscape before me. The Sea of Galilee was just down the hill below me and only a short distance away was the town of Capernaum where Jesus had healed Peter's mother-in-law. Capernaum was the same place that Jesus healed all who were sick.

As that moment continued, different Bible Stories that I had heard or read throughout the years were starting to come alive in my mind. It was an amazing day. But then there was one thing more that really jumped out at me as I sat there day dreaming. Off to my right about halfway down the coastline was the city of Tiberias. Tiberias looked to be the largest city along the coast of the Sea of Galilee. It reached from the sea all the way up to a large mountain range.

In the same chapter (Matthew 5) of the Beatitudes Jesus spoke about a city on a hill. I thought for sure when I saw this city, that it must be the City that Jesus was speaking about when he said we are to be the light of the World. (Matthew 5:14), Jesus said, "A city on a hill cannot be hidden, neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven."

#### Constitution Bowl to be Livestreamed

Amelia Island TV and the U.S. Constitution Scholarship Foundation have agreed to livestream the U.S. Constitution Bowl which will be held

at Yulee High School on Monday, May 17 at 6:30 p.m. This year's competition will have an in-person audience limited to 200 spectators. The livestream will be available to everyone, free-of-charge on Amelia Island TV's YouTube channel and Facebook Live.

The Constitution Bowl, which is Nassau County's

Academic Super Bowl, is modeled after the GE College Bowl and showcases the intelligence and talent of our Nassau County high school students. There will be 5 teams comprised of four players each representing the four high schools and the home-educated community. West Nassau High School's team, coached by Caleb Bryan, was the winner of the 2019 Constitution Bowl; and Fernandina Beach High School's team finished 2nd. Superintendent of Nassau County Schools Dr. Kathy Burns summarized the last competition with a note to the USCSF Board that read,

"What an outstanding event. Thank you for your vision and the execution of that vision. The evening was beyond our expectations, great crowd, great

students and challenging competition."

The competition consists of two rounds. The first round involving all the teams will be approximately 30 minutes. Then the 20 minute second round squares off the 2 top-scoring teams of the first round. If the teams are tied after the 2nd round, there

will be a sudden death playoff. Bradley Bean will repeat his role as moderator of the contest.

The members of the winning team each receive a \$1,000 scholarship and the 2nd place team members each receive a \$250 scholarship. The winning school will hold the U.S. Constitution Bowl trophy.



## The Importance of Mammograms... Meet Tammy Holland

Tammy Holland was just a normal young woman living her life. It came the time in her life that she should start doing mammograms. In 2002, she made her first mammogram

appointment and went. Well, rather than getting a letter of the report, she received a call from the doctor advising her that something looked a little odd but they really wanted to wait another six months and do another mammogram. Of course, this was her first mammogram and she was shocked, but not too troubled, as the doctor didn't seem to be.

fed breast cancer.

She went back in six months and had another one. Yep, it was cancer, but it was very deep and not detected by a breast exam. A biopsy was done and she was diagnosed with progesterone estrogen

Tammy had a lumpectomy in October, where they took the lump and some lymph nodes. "They actually removed four lymph nodes and thankfully only two had cancer cells," said Tammy. "I was living in Atlanta at the time and working a fulltime job. I was also told the cancer was aggressive and they would be treating it aggressively."

Aggressive meant, four chemotherapy treatments, one each month: November, December, January and February. Tammy recalls being nauseated but never being sick, which she is thankful for, however she lost all her hair after the first treatment. She never missed a day at work and her job and co-workers were so helpful. "We had a clinic at work and the nurse kept a cot just for me," added Tammy. "There were times I just was so weak and tired. But I kept going. I'm thankful that I was working with some great co-workers that really helped me out."

Following chemo, radiation therapy started in March for six weeks, 5 days a week. The radiation treatments were short but as time went on they really began to

burn. Today, Tammy still feels the burning sensation under her arm.

"Cancer is always scary! Hearing the 'C' word is bad and scary and that's why I think the best advice I can give is to always take a loved one with you to the doctor appointments. It's always good to have two sets of ears to hear," continued Tammy. "Many times I thought they said one thing and it wasn't right. Chemo and radiation

have so many side effects and it's good to try to know all of them. If someone is with you to hear, it does help."

Tammy is here today, 19 years later, cancer free! Who knows what would have happened had she not returned 6 months later to have another mammogram. Tammy gives all the glory to the Lord that gave her the strength to beat this monster. "I think back to my mother, who was blind. Mom was diagnosed with breast cancer and she beat it," said Tammy. "I asked the Lord to please help me to be brave like my mother was and He did. She was healed. I'm so thankful I went back to have the second mammogram."
