The Wisdom Literature

This is the fifth article in our series of overviewing the Bible this year. We have covered a lot of ground in our first four articles. In these four months, we have covered the Torah and the Historical Books. The overall storyline of the historical books deals with the creation of the universe and the creation of the Hebrew people in Genesis and the promise of land. The book of Exodus shows us how God redeemed his people from bondage.

He took the people out of Egypt and brought them into the promised land (Exodus-Joshua). The rest of the historical books show God prospered his people in the land (Samuel-I Kings 11) and how God exiled the people from the land because of covenant unfaithfulness (I Kings12-II Chronicles). God did not abandon his people in exile, but he brought them back into the land (Ezra-Esther). Even though the people are back in the land, we are yearning for a greater restoration and greater King. This King will be Jesus who gives his people a new heaven and new earth forever and ever.

We now turn the next group of writings in the Old Testament. This group of writings is called the Wisdom Literature. In the Hebrew Bible, these writings are distributed in various places throughout the Old Testament canon. The English Bible places these 5 books immediately after the historical books. The wisdom literature is not in chronological order. For example, the book of Job is the oldest book in the Bible. The writers of these books include David and Solomon. This means that the wisdom literature fits into the historical books. The wisdom literature is some of the most practical literature in the entire Bible. These five books teach us how to live.

- Job: How to Suffer: The wisdom literature is complimentary and show us how to live life from all angles. The book of Proverbs speaks of the apparent order in creation and the book of Job teaches us about the mystery of order in Creation. Job begins with the conflict between God and Satan regarding Job (1-2). Chapters (3-26) are three cycles of debate between Job and his three miserable comforters regarding Job's suffering. The book concludes with 3 monologues (27-42) from Job, Elihu, and God. Job teaches us that God is sovereign over suffering and God has the power to bring beauty out of ashes.
- Psalms: How to Praise. The book of Psalms is the longest book in the Bible. Psalms is made of 5 different books (1,41; 42-72; 73-89; 90-106; 107-150) that develop the kingship over God over all the earth and our proper response to God in worship throughout all of life's times and seasons. King David was the composer of a little over half of the Psalms. Psalm 1-2 serves as introduction to the entire Psalter. These Psalms were Israel's ancient hymnal and they serve as a rich resource in our worship of God.
- Proverbs: How to Live. The book of Proverbs was written primarily by Solomon. Proverbs is a rich resource of wisdom for all of life. Proverbs is the Old Testament equivalent to the book of James. Proverbs are not promises, but they are

throughout their activities.

At Hilliard Elementary School, Mrs. Nancy Johnson's class is learning about writing opinion pieces. Students are excited to share about their favorite games, from video games to Candy Land. They are also learning the important life skill of balancing a checkbook as they 'earn' and 'spend'

wisdom on how life usually works. The overall structure of Proverbs is that wisdom is be sought (1-9), wisdom is to be followed (10-22a), wisdom is to be heard (22b-24), and wisdom is to be lived (25-31).

- Ecclesiastes: How to have Meaning. As strange as this sound, Ecclesiastes is my favorite book in the Old Testament. The book explores the reality of whether or not life has meaning. This book was probably written by Solomon. The book begins his thesis that all is vanity (1:1-11), continues with his defense of his thesis from his personal quest for meaning (1:1-12-6), and concludes his counsel to fear God (7-12).
- Song of Solomon: How to Love. Song of Solomon teaches us how to love. This was presumably Solomon's masterpiece. The Song is not an allegory between Christ's love for his church, but it does point to Christ's love for the church in a typological way. This song is not simply erotic poetry. The Song of Solomon shows how love progresses from courtship (1:3:5), to marriage (3:6-5:1), to the struggle to love in marriage (5:2-7:10), and the growth and the maturity of love (7:11-8:14).



Hilliard Town News

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of May. The first agenda item was a presentation by Mayor John Beasley announcing a donation to the Hilliard Youth Football Club of \$500 on behalf of the Northeast Florida League of Cities.

The first order of business was the approval of the Annual Financial Statements and Audit for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2023.

The next three agenda items included projects at the Hilliard Airpark that are 100% funded by the Florida Department of Transportation. The first was the council approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 20 to AECOM for the Design and building contract documents for a new Hangar Building at the Airpark. "At this time the Airpark is at 100% capacity with airplanes," said Bill Prange, PE AECOM. "This project will add another Hangar to the Airpark, which is needed."

The second item was the approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 21 to AECOM for the Environmental Assessment for the north and south property acquisitions at the Hilliard Airpark. "This project is where a team can do shovel digs on the properties

and document any findings," added Prange.

The third and final Airpark item was the approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 22 to AECOM for Runway Protection Zone clearing of trees at the Hilliard Airpark.

The next agenda item was the approval of Capital expenditure for the Wastewater Collection SCADA System Expansion from Energy Engineering Systems, LLC in the amount of \$18,722.

The following item was also from the Public Works Department, concerning the council approval for the repair of Well #4's seal from Complete Services Well Drilling, Inc., not to exceed \$6,950. "The repair could be less but I wanted to get the price for worst case scenario," said Public Works Director Joel Hall.

Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenburg requested approval for additional seasonal staff: Summer Camp Counselors and Swimming Pool Lifeguards. The council approved the request.

The council approved the approval to surplus the Hilliard Volunteer Fire Department's 2007 Ford Explorer command vehicle and sale it to the Town of Callahan for \$3,500.

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, June 6 at 7 p.m.



Simpkins Announces Candidacy for School Board Seat


