Relay for Life Event This Saturday



For the last four weeks, we have been publishing stories from survivors of cancer. These stories were true and were from our local friends and neighbors. Cancer is a horrible disease that has no discrimination. It affects men and women, young and old. Almost everyone has been touched by cancer in one way or another in their lives. We published these stories to remind people of the local Relay for Life event happening this Saturday. Let's make sure to support this event and crush cancer!

The Relay for Life of Nassau County will be held this Saturday, May 7 from 3-10 p.m. at the NE FL Fairgrounds in Callahan. This year's theme is "A Radical Relay" (80's - 90's). The event will be held in the open-air area of the fairgrounds, where the walking track is available. Everyone is encouraged to park and enter from the back paved parking lot. Opening ceremonies will begin at 3 p.m. with remarks by Wanda Nichols, Event Lead Chair Person. This will be Wanda's last year as Lead Chair Person for the event. Pastor Walter Cooper and NCSO Chaplain will deliver the invocation with a flag presentation by West Nassau JROTC and National Anthem sung by Megan Stanford. Survivors and Caregivers will be recognized and then take their lap to the multipurpose building for the survivor/caregiver reception. There will be activities for the survivors and



caregivers while at the reception. While the reception is going on, DJ Doug will entertain everyone on the fairgrounds until the reception is over.







New Gas Line in Callahan?

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting in May. The only business on the agenda was an item for discussion about a possible franchise agreement with Florida Public Utilities Company. Town Manager Mike Williams advised the council that the owners of the new Zaxby's coming to town would like to have natural gas at the restaurant for their fryers. "You (council) have an ordinance to look over. You will see places where I and the attorney have made some changes to the ordinance," said Williams. "The town would receive 6% of the revenue from the company."

"This would mean we would have more lines ran throughout the town?" asked Councilman David Mellecker.

"Yes, that would definitely happen if we chose to do this," added Williams. "We have high pressure gas lines very deep. The only low pressure lines we have in town are by West Nassau High School and Callahan Elementary School."

Town Attorney Reba Pearce advised the council to look over the ordinance and think about what was said tonight. Think about: Who would benefit? Would residents or businesses be interested in using natural gas? Is it worth all the construction and destruction around town? Use this time to think things over before the next meeting.

In closing comments, Mayor Matthew Davis reminded the council about the joint workshop concerning the July 3 fireworks with the Town of Hilliard and Fair staff on Monday, May 9 at 6 p.m. at the fairgrounds.

Williams also reminded the council about the National Day of Prayer service Thursday, May 5 at 6:30 p.m. at Ewing Park.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, May 16 at 7 p.m.



Mom Still Challenges Me

Ann Card Schumann was the wisest women I have ever known. She was born in Canada and grew up on a farm in Vermont. She was the fourth oldest of 13 children. She lived through the great depression, so wasting food at her dinner table was one of her pet peeves. She only had an eighth-grade education because she had to drop out of school to begin working to help support her family financially.

All that she was able to start and finish in her lifetime would challenge the best entrepreneur! She and Dad opened "Ann's Diner" in the town of Callahan in 1948 with just \$100 to their name. She managed her business like a brilliant minded executive. She invested in additional property. She was a savvy, old-school landlord who never signed a lease. She told me, "A person's word was their contract." She was generous. At Ann's Diner she never turned away a hungry soul if they did not have the money to pay. If they insisted, she would find a small chore for them to do to allow them to "pay" for their meal.


She was strong. She raised 13 children. She helped finish raising my father's five children from his first marriage. She had six children of her own. She took in her best friend's (Marie Gowen) two children when she died and finished raising them. She became a widow for the first time in 1977 with six children under her roof. I thought my upbringing was normal. I didn't realize that all my friends were not taught how to work. The responsibility that she had us assume was that of an adult. She never questioned whether we could handle it or not. She asked. We did.

She had an unstoppable work ethic. In retirement she only worked five hours a day. Mom would always say, "We've gotta make hay while the sun is shining." She worked until she was 85. They just aren't made like her anymore. The era in which she lived and thrived was remarkable.

She fulfilled personal goals. With the help of Sandy Wilfong, she accomplished her GED (General Educational Diploma) at the age of 63. She gained her United States citizenship at the age of 74.

She was a servant leader. She selflessly served her church, Our Lady of Consolation. She served her community by delivering her customer's favorite meals when they became homebound. Because of the impact that was made on her, when her second husband, George Schumann died, she became a hospice volunteer. She would also visit the nursing home in Hilliard and deliver home cooked meals and visit with the residents. She modeled Christ's love for others.

Mom passed away with no debt. Everything she owned was a direct result of her hard work. She left us with a modest inheritance, but most importantly she left us with a legacy. Her steadfastness, servant's heart, selflessness, tenacity, love and service for The Lord and work ethic still challenge me to this day. Mom, I accept the challenge.

If you hear the name Freddie Walker, to some it may ring a bell, to others not so much. However, if you say the name Freddie, the nice guy who worked

Callahan Dollar at General, many know who he is. Freddie has been a model employee for over 8 years. He transferred one time to go to Gainesville to be with his ailing father, but transferred back when his father passed away. Freddie was always the guy who had a smile on his face and would help you out in the store if you asked him. Freddie

rode his bicycle to work every day. His life is one of determination to make it. He lives out US 301 with a friend he met at Dollar General. He was down on his luck and his friend, Tia Chavarria (her mom & brother), took him in to live at their house. It was from their home on US 301 that he rode his bicycle to work.

On March 17, 2022, Freddie's life changed again. Just one week prior, Freddie had purchased a motorized bicycle. He was thrilled. On his way to work early March 17, Freddie was hit by a car on US 301. From the accident he received a brain bleed, fractured left arm and wrist, a tracheotomy and removal of his spleen. Since his hospital stay, he was transferred to PAM Health Acute Care Hospital for Rehabilitation. Currently, the hospital is looking for another facility to better serve Freddie's needs.

Freddie has insurance however the medical bills are continuing to add up. Many people have contacted us asking how they can help Freddie and hopefully get him back to work. We, the


