Hilliard Approves Rezoning for Apartment Complex

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their last meeting of June. The first agenda item was a presentation from Candece Tierney, C.O.O. of Starting Point Behavioral Healthcare. "I am honored to be here tonight to let you know soon, we are hopeful for July 15, that Starting Point will open their Callahan location, located at 617225 Brandies Avenue," said Tierney. "I just wanted to share with you a few of the opportunities available for westside residents. We will offer Outpatient Therapy: for individuals, groups and families, to help with addressing patient concerns, treatments and relationships. Care Coordination: to help individuals living with a diagnosed mental illness to achieve their highest level of functioning. Child Welfare: Our family services team helps to provide a dedicated children and families by Child Welfare System." They also offer Problem Solving Courts, Medical Services, Substance Use Disorder Program and much more. The most important offering is a Mobile Response Team at 904-580-0529; and a 24/7 Crisis Hotline at 904-206-1756.

The Major Prophets

We are now up to the last major group of writings in the Old Testament. The books referred to as the Prophets make up the last 18 books of the Old Testament. The Prophets are divided into two groups (major and minor prophets). This designation has nothing to do with their authority or message, this is simply because of their length. The major prophets consist of 6 books (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, and Daniel). The 12

remaining minor prophets were originally called the book of the 12 in the Hebrew Bible. We will examine the content of the Minor Prophets next month.

The major prophets are not arranged in chronological order. These writing prophets were not the only prophets that were operative in Israel and Judah. Elijah and Elisha were considered to be the greatest prophets of Israel, but they were not writing prophets. The historical background of the prophets are found in the books of Kings and Chronicles. Isaiah and Jeremiah were pre-exilic prophets. This simply means that their books were written before the exile. Jeremiah was the author of Jeremiah and Lamentations and books covered the fall of Jerusalem and he was taken into exile personally. The books of Ezekiel and Daniel were written during the exile.

• Isaiah: Isaiah is commonly referred to as the prophet of God's salvation. Isaiah is a beautiful and eloquent writer and his writings contain some of the most memorable passages and prophecies in the Old Testament. The book of Isaiah is divided into three major sections. Chapters 1-36 are messages of judgment, followed by a historical interlude in chapters 37-39, and concludes with his message of salvation through the Suffering Servant of the Lord in chapters 40-66.

• Jeremiah: Jeremiah is viewed as the prophet of God's judgment. The book of Jeremiah is brutally honest about his experience and struggle as a prophet. Jeremiah's prophecies are arranged in a thematic way as he experiences the effects of God's judgment after warning the people repeatedly of the looming disaster. Chapters 1-33 are written before the fall of Jerusalem, chapters 34-45 reveal the fall of Jerusalem, and chapters 46-52 deal with the aftermath of the fall.

• Lamentations: Lamentations is a book of poetry that reveals the lament of Jeremiah regarding the fall of Jerusalem. Lamentations consists of 5 poetic laments that reveal the horrifying realty of judgment on the people of God. The poems reveal the devastation of judgment from the vantage point of a broken city (chapter 1), a broken people (chapter 2), a suffering prophet (chapter 3), and ruined kingdom (chapter 4), and a humbled nation in (chapter 5).

• Ezekiel: Ezekiel is the weirdest and most eccentric prophet in the Bible. The major theme in Ezekiel's writing is the glory of God. Of all of the prophets, Ezekiel gives us a picture of a big God whose purposes are not limited to Israel. Ezekiel presents God as a God of Glory (1-3), a God of judgment (4-24), the God of the nations (25-32), the God of hope (33-36), the God of life (37-39), and the God of the future (40-48).

• Daniel: Daniel is probably the most famous of the major prophets. Daniel speaks of the future of God's kingdom and his people. Daniel was an exile in Babylon and his prophetic writings are included in the wisdom literature in the Hebrew Bible. Daniel's prophecy showed the exiles how to have a distinctive faith in exile. Faith in God is fostered by the simple fact that God rules the world. Since God rules, God's people will not compromise (1), take credit for what God alone does (2), bow to idols and remain loyal to God even if the result is death (3-6), and by knowing that God has planned the future (7-12).

Attempted Murder Stems from Online Dispute

Nassau County The Sheriff's Office held а news conference Monday, regarding an arrest in an second-degree attempted murder case. The incident involved 20-year-old Edward Kang, who allegedly flew

from New Jersey to Florida to confront an individual in Fernandina Beach following an online dispute. The two were playing a video game online, from their prospective homes, that includes role playing with different characters. Obviously, something went wrong, in the game, causing Kang to fly to Florida to confront the victim.

On Sunday, June 23, The Nassau County Sheriff's Office responded to a Fernandina Beach residence as the lead investigator of an attempted second-degree murder with a weapon and armed burglary. Upon arrival, deputies observed a substantial amount of blood located near the entry way and into a bedroom. Both the victim and



the subject were not present. Shortly after, the victim was observed lying face down on the ground and noticed he was laying atop another individual who was in possession of a hammer.

Both were transported

to Baptist Nassau, where deputies spoke with the victim that stated he was playing an online game. Later, he walked to the doorway of the room and opened the door. There stood a person with a hammer raised in the air ready to strike. The suspect, Edward Kang, struck the victim atop the head with the hammer. The victim began to defend himself and was struggling with Kang to obtain the hammer from his grasp. A family member heard the yells for help and called 911.

Edward H. Kang, 20, of New Jersey, was arrested and charged with Attempted 2nd Degree Murder; and Armed Burglary.

Celebration of the United States Flag

As we, proud citizens of the United States of America, celebrate Our Independence on July 4th, let's remember some important moments in history of "Old Glory," our American Flag. I am the flag of the United States of America. I was conceived in the dreams of liberty and the hopes of freedom. Though I was never an orphan, my current form of Red, White & Blue was adopted by the Continental Congress in 1777 and proclaimed the National Emblem of a nation newly born on this continent, fighting valiantly for survival and destined to bring to all mankind a new concept of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

I have been many places and witnessed many events in our American History. I was born shorty after the midnight ride of Paul Revere that led to the shot that was heard round the world at the battles of Lexington & Concord, and when General George Washington became our first Commander in Chief. I felt the biting cold at Valley Forge and gave comfort to the tired and hungry Continental Army. I saw Molley Pitcher take the cannon swab from the hands of her wounded husband and helped carry on the fight for freedom.

I was flown above the decks of "Old Ironside," and John Paul Jones' warship the "Ranger" during the Revolutionary War. I was still flying after the bombardment by the British in the late twighlight at Fort McHenry during War of 1812 inspiring Francis Scott Key to write, The Star-Spangled Banner. I blazed the trail west with Daniel Boone and Davey Crockett. I stood beside Crockett and Jim Bowie at the Alamo. I was carried by troops during the Civil War. I fell to the ground at Custer's Last Stand at Little Big Horn and there were no friendly hands left to pick me up. i was carried by Black Jack Pershing's army during WWI.
