County Commissioner Bell Arrested for DUI

According to reports, last Tuesday, June 21 at approximately 5:30 p.m., Nassau County Commissioner Chair, District 2, Aaron Bell was arrested for Driving Under the Influence. A Fernandina Beach Police Officer pulled Bell over on Sadler Road after observing his vehicle weave within its lane and drive over the marked lanes. Bell told the officer he had just dropped his daughter off at a church function prior to being pulled over. Bell also did not have his driver's license with him.

When asked by the officer if he had been drinking, Bell answered, "No". The officer added that Bell appeared

Bell told the officer, "My wife knows you."


In the video, you hear the officer ask, "Who is your wife?"

The officer replied, "No. Why are you different than anyone else I do a DUI investigation with? Because of who your wife is? It don't work that







"Now therefore take, I pray thee, thy weapons, thy quiver and thy bow, and go out to the field, and take me some venison;" Genesis 27:3






