Join us Thursday, July 4 at the Northeast Florida Fairgrounds, 543378 US Highway 1, Callahan, as the Towns of Hilliard and Callahan and the Nassau County Bicentennial present an incredible 4th of July Celebration. The gates will open for the festive event at 4 p.m. Thursday.

For the past three years, the towns of Hilliard and Callahan have joined together to present the fireworks display. This year, in honor of Nassau County Celebrating their Bicentennial, the county has also joined forces in donating more money to make this Fireworks Display bigger and better!

The event is free to the public! Entry and parking will be off of Musslewhite Road. Guests are encouraged to bring your lawn chairs and enjoy all the festivities on the midway field. There will be several food trucks in the midway for purchasing your favorite foods, snacks and drinks. There will also be some carnival style games provided by local businesses and groups.

There will be live music at the pavilion featuring Four Barrel and Whiskey Heart beginning at 4:30 p.m. The bands will be highlighting music that was produced, mixed or engineered by Nassau County's very own Rodney Mills. Mr. Mills will also be presented with a proclamation from the Town of Hilliard proclaiming Rodney Mills Day in the Town of Hilliard, July 4, 2024. Mr. Mills and his family will be present for the entire day enjoying all the events.

Most Patriotic Attire Contest judging begins (booth under the pavilion at 4 -6 p.m.). Participants can dress in their most patriotic outfits and stop by the judges' booth to enter the contest. The top 5 entries will be selected. At 7:30 p.m., with the crowd's help, the panel of judges will select the winner.

In the Kitchen...

1 small head green cabbage, quartered 1/2 cup olive oil

1 teaspoon Montreal steak seasoning

1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper 1/4 cup real bacon bits

Smoked Cabbage

Preheat a smoker to 250° according to manufacturer's directions. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Place cabbage wedges on prepared baking sheet. In a small bowl, whisk olive oil, steak seasoning, salt, and pepper until evenly combined. Brush mixture over the cabbage wedges. Place baking sheet on the grate of the preheated smoker and smoke for 1 1/2 hours. Transfer to a serving dish and top with bacon pieces. Serve immediately.



Storage Units Can be a Waste of Money

There are occasions that I say, "Only in America." There are folks that have large homes that rent storage units to put some of their stuff in because all their stuff will not fit under their roof. They want to hold onto to their stuff but do not consider the cost involved for holding onto their stuff.

Renting a storage unit can be expensive to maintain, while your stuff just sits there collecting dust. The average 10 x 15 storage unit in Jacksonville, costs \$200 a month. That is a whopping \$2,400 a year. If you use this unit for three years that would cost, you \$7,200. Should you rent a storage unit? To help you know the answer, you must first determine the value of your stuff and the length of time you would need storage. If you have a bedroom suit, washing machine and valuables that are worth \$4,800 and you were going to need a unit for more than two years then you might be better off selling your items now and repurchasing needed items later.

You do not want to be the family that stores \$2,300 worth of stuff for six years for \$14,400. To me that is throwing money to the wind...but it happens often.

If you need a storage unit for 18 months, multiply the fee by 18 (months) to see the cost of rental. Then give your stuff a practical value to determine if your stuff is worth more than the rental



cost. If the value of your stuff is more than the rental cost, then it is usually wiser to rent for a while, as needed. For example, if you need a spot to store your belongings while building a new home (average home build is 12 months) then it might make sense to hold onto your stuff in storage.

For the record, I am not totally against using storage units. We had to rent a storage unit for one month when my son was in between apartments in college. In this instance, it was worth the value of having a safe space to keep his stuff.

To unlock the proverbial storage lock, if you do not know the end date for the use of the storage unit, then there is a good chance it would be financially wiser for you to sell your stuff and repurchase later as needed.






Naturally Nassau Our Voting Voices

choices!" he said afterward.



Four Arrested for High-End Food and Stanley Cup Heist

On Saturday, the Nassau County Sheriff's Office responded to a theft at the Hagan Ace Hardware Store on Miner Road in Yulee. Store personnel reported that four suspects entered the premises and stole 24 Stanley cups, concealing them in their shirts and bags before fleeing in a silver Chevy Malibu.

An off-duty lieutenant, hearing a BOLO (Be On the Lookout) alert over the radio, spotted the suspects' vehicle at the intersection of Arrigo Boulevard and State Road 200. The vehicle was subsequently stopped in the Winn-Dixie parking lot, where all four suspects were detained.

Further investigation revealed that the group had targeted multiple locations across Nassau County, including two Winn-Dixie stores in Yulee and Callahan, as well as two Ace Hardware stores. The total value of stolen merchandise is estimated at around \$5,000. "This case demonstrates the importance of vigilance and quick action. Our offduty lieutenant's attentiveness led to the swift apprehension of these suspects, potentially preventing further thefts. We remain committed to protecting our local businesses and community from such criminal activities," said Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper.

During the search of the suspects' vehicle, deputies discovered several Stanley cups and a variety of high-end

food items from Winn-Dixie, including crab meat, lobster tail, bacon, steak, and an assortment of champagne.

The following individuals were arrested and charged with felony grand theft and conspiracy to commit retail theft: Stacey Sullivan, 46; Kaneki Hickson, 51; Montavia Sullivan, 23; and Tracy Sullivan, 46. "It's clear these criminals had expensive taste, targeting luxury food items and popular merchandise across multiple stores in our county, however, I can assure you that champagne and lobster are not on the menu at Hotel Nassau County Jail," continued Sheriff Leeper.

All four suspects have been booked into the Nassau County Jail.

discussions with your commissioner. I also would like to have meetings held close by. I think a Satellite Office would be that solution.


