Yet, if we look at popular culture, there are a multitude of voices crying out to justify this very behavior. These voices will go as far as to demand that we accept their desires as legitimate even when we express to them that they are blind to fallout of these desires. We are not immune to this ourselves. 

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their final meeting of August. Town Manager Mike Williams advised the council about the opportunity to apply for a \$50,000 FRDAP (Florida Recreation Development Assistance

Program) Grant. "The deadline to apply is August 31 if the council chooses to do so," said Williams.

"Where would be put the money to use?" asked Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming.

"The 5 & under playground really needs an upgrade of equipment," added Williams. "We can also look to renovate the tennis courts."

Resolution 2022-R07 was approved which concerns the submission of the application to apply with the state of Florida for the FRDAP Grant.

The next agenda item concerned a response from a land owner that had received a code violation letter. Town Clerk Shawna Gugliuzza advised the council that a letter had been received from the homeowner at 449555 US Highway 301. The property is the two story house at the corner of US 301 and Mickler Street. The letter stated the person is requesting an extension due to a hardship, health issues and a death in the family. The homeowner wants to

retain a structural engineer to see if the home strong enough to be renovated.

The council approved allowing a 90 day extension for the homeowner.

In closing comments, Williams advised the council that he had been communicating with the Nassau

County School Board and
Transportation Department
concerning students walking
along Martin Luther King, Jr.
Avenue due to bus shortages.
"We will be trying to
engineer a sidewalk on MLK,
however it will not take place

until the construction of Hagan Ace Hardware is complete.

Councilwomen Fleming and Ashton Vargas both discussed applying to the Safer Routes to School Program. Town Clerk Gugliuzza advised the council that she had already been looking in to the program and has already done some of the preliminary webinars.

Gugliuzza also advised the council that she had received calls from citizens about not having any speed bumps on Page Street.

Williams advised that he is working on having one speed bump/ramp added to the road at some time.

The next regular meeting of the council will be held Tuesday, September 5 at 7 p.m. due to the Monday Labor Day holiday.

Barnabas & Community Help Children for School

A quick search on the internet cited several polls from 2021 estimating the cost of sending a child back to school in the fall to wildly range from just under \$500 to near \$1,000. Nassau County parents know back-to-school costs can stretch an already tight budget. For the parents of an estimated 400-plus children in Nassau County who are housing insecure, back-to-school costs are beyond reachable. Who can they turn to help fill the budget gap?

Again. this year, Barnabas Center collected school supplies from community members and local businesses in an effort aimed directly at delivering these essential supplies to over 100 newly-enrolled Nassau County students qualifying under the district's FIT (Families in Transition) program. With donations from nearly 50 businesses and individuals, Barnabas collected 620-plus pounds of supplies (backpacks, pencils, paper, pens, headphones, erasers, etc.) in the weeks leading up to school opening. "Two full pallets of backpacks and school supplies were delivered. We cannot thank Barnabas or our community enough for the support that has been shown for our families experiencing homelessness," said Mollie Cressey, the school district's program manager for the FIT programs. "FIT volunteers spent all week packing bags (early this month) and students shortly after began picking up their backpacks to be ready for the first day of school," added Ms.


Jamie Reynolds, President/CEO at Barnabas Center cited the backpack






