NCSO Hosts Teen Citizen Academy

On Wednesday, July 21 and Thursday, July 22, the Nassau County Sheriff's Office conducted their very first Teen Citizen Academy for kids 12-18. Twenty-eight kids participated in the two day academy that provided insight into the sheriff's office operations and equipment they use to help keep Nassau County safe.

The academy, taught by deputies, gave young people a look at the inner workings of the Nassau County Sheriff's Office. Activities included a study of various jobs within NCSO such as 911 dispatchers, patrol deputies, detention deputies, detectives, crime scene evidence collection, special response team, narcotics, k-9 unit, drone operations, motorcycles, civilian positions and more. Students were also able to tour the facilities and sample



some of the specialty equipment deputies utilize. The program exposes young people to what it's like to be a police officer and gives them a behind the badge look in hopes they will

consider a career in law enforcement in the future.

"We want them to get a better understanding as to why we do the things that we do to keep our community safe. We also want to build that trust



with our youth. We want them to look at us, if they need us, they can depend on us, and trust us, and ultimately we want to continue with that partnership," said Sheriff Bill Leeper.

At the end of the class, participants were presented a certificate of completion and challenge coin from Sheriff Leeper.







Suffering and the Tribulation, and other Things Christians Disagree On

Full Disclosure: I lied; I won't be talking about "other things." But, doesn't the title "Suffering and the Tribulation" just sound sad. I think it's understood in our culture today that whenever an advertisement says "and so much more" there really isn't anything more. But I digress.

There is much disagreement concerning the order of end time events. What will come first, the return of Christ or a time of great suffering, distress and hardship known as the tribulation? One of the concerns is will Christ followers have to suffer the

tribulation. One argument I find interesting is that it is not unusual for Christians to suffer on earth.

When I first heard this, I thought, really? How many of us have thought that if we come to Christ it's all rainbows and unicorns from then on? How many preachers have only mentioned the prosperity? But, when I took a closer look at the Bible, I realized that suffering and being a Christian are not mutually exclusive. In fact, in other parts of the world, suffering for the Gospel of Jesus Christ is expected.

For Paul, suffering was part of the mission: "...far more imprisonments, with countless beatings, and often near death. Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches." 2 Corinthians 11:23-28

It seems like such a strange idea, to suffer for the Kingdom of God. But for Paul it was an honor. "For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake," Philippians 1:29 ESV.

Oddly enough, Paul didn't view suffering as we do today. Paul saw it as nothing when he compared it to what is to come. "For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison" 2 Corinthians 4:17 ESV. Paul's list above does not seem light or momentary to me, but in this same letter, he feels it is. The reason for this is that he is so engulfed in Jesus that not even suffering phases him. When we come to Christ, our life does not become easy. The change is that we no longer walk this path alone. We walk in the power of the Holy Spirit.

I am not suggesting we need to go out and look for suffering. And thank God that we can share about Jesus in this country without fear of persecution. But, could we be more bold with the Good News of what Christ has done? Could we share more about what He has done in our lives? Could we grow closer in our walk with Jesus to the point that we don't fear what others may think when we talk about the One we love?







Callahan Sets Tentative Millage Rate

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting of August with three council members present and two councilpersons teleconferencing, along with the mayor and attorney. The only order of business on the agenda was to set the tentative millage rate for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. Town Manager Mike Williams advised the council concerning the options on deciding what rate to choose. "The rollback rate from last year was 2.2799 with a taxable value of \$104,123,126," said Williams. "The other option is an operating millage of 2.4723 mils that would increase the taxable value to \$112,909,268 for the upcoming year."

Councilman David Mellecker made a motion to set the tentative millage rate at 2.4723 mils and Councilwoman Ashton Vargas made the second. "This way if we need to go down we can, but now we have something to go by," said Mellecker.

In closing comments, Mellecker

requested to have the Fireworks placed on the next agenda just to get the council's feedback from what they thought of the fireworks display.

Council President Ken Bass requested to set a workshop to discuss Ace Hardware. Mellecker advised the council that he would prefer to discuss Ace in a regular meeting.

Mayor Matt Davis added that he joined a meeting with Williams, Bass and Brandies owners concerning offering the town the first option to purchase their building. "Brandies wanted the town (Callahan) to have the first option to purchase the building and properties," said Davis. "I think they have had many people inquiring about what will happen to the building. They (Brandies) just need to know as soon as possible if we (council) are interested in all or just some of the property."

The council requested to have Brandies added to the next agenda.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, August 16 at 7 p.m.




