Hilliard Approves 37.35 Acres Annexation

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their first meeting of August. The first five agenda items were Public Hearings. The first was the Public Hearing and Second and Final Reading on Ordinance 2024-06. The Ordinance concerned annexing into the corporate limits of Hilliard, three parcels real property containing approximately 37.35 acres; finding said annexation to be consistent with the Town of Hilliard's Comprehensive Plan and Town Code; Amending Section 2.03 of the Town Charter to include said land; updating of the official Town maps. The council approved Ordinance 2024-06, annexation of 37.35 acres.

The second ordinance, was a First Reading and Public Hearing on Ordinance 2024-07, which concerned Amending the Hilliard Comprehensive Plan, Future Land Use Map designation of property consisting of 16.32 acres, more or less; located on the east side of US Highway 1 and south of Cosmos Trail; adding the designation of Commercial. The council approved Ordinance 2024-07 on First Reading, with Final Reading set for Thursday, September 5, 2024.

The third ordinance, was also First Reading and Public Hearing

on Ordinance 2024-08, which concerned changing the Zoning Designation from Nassau County Zoning Open Rural to Town Zoning C-1, General Commercial District; for 16.32 acres more or less; located on the east side of US Highway 1 and south of Cosmos Trail, Hilliard. The council approved Ordinance 2024-08 on First Reading, with

Final Reading and Public Hearing set for Thursday, September 5, 2024.

The fourth ordinance, was also First Reading and Public Hearing on Ordinance 2024-09, which concerned Amending the Hilliard Comprehensive Plan, Future Land Use Map designation of 21.03 acres, more or less; located on the east side of US Highway 1 at Cosmos Trail, Hilliard; adding the designation of Commercial and High Density Residential. The council approved Ordinance 2024-09 on First Reading, with Final Reading and Public Hearing set for Thursday, September 5, 2024.

The fifth and final ordinance, First Reading and Public Hearing on Ordinance 2024-10, which concerned changing the Zoning Designation from Nassau County Zoning Open Rural to Town Zoning PUD, Planned Unit Development; for the property located on the east side of US Highway 1 and south of Eastwood Road. This property, Lofty project, is planned for a 227 multi-residential and commercial use facility. The owner plans to build 1-2 bedroom townhomes in the area. The council approved Ordinance 2024-10 on First Reading, with Final Reading and Public Hearing set for Thursday,

Barnabas Receives Memorial Day Rod Run Donation

On May 25, 2024, the 5th Annual Memorial Day Rod Run 4 Kidz was held at Callahan Methodist Church. The event was one of the largest with 159 entries. All the spectators, and of course all the volunteers, made the day seem effortless! "We are so thankful to Callahan Methodist Church fellowship that continues to support the event by hosting it and so many other ways," said Mangold. "There's no way we could put on this event without all their help and the host of volunteers!"


Last Wednesday, Brad Mangold, organizer of the event, was happy to present Barnabas Center CEO Jamie Reynolds and Trish Thompson, Volunteer Services Manager, a donation of \$9,000, from this year's May event. To date, the event has donated close to \$20,000 to the Barnabas Center to help children.

"As we learned from Trish (from Barnabas) at the event, that there are over 400 homeless children in Nassau County," said Mangold. "The number is frightening. This event continues to grow larger each year and we're so thankful for everyone who pitches in for children. When the event was started, the mission was that the monies collected would go towards helping children or students in some way."

Almost all of the proceeds from the event will go to help support the FIT (Families in Transition) program. This program provides backpacks of food sent home with these children on the weekend so they are ensured they have food to eat. "We are beyond thankful to accept this wonderful gift for these children," said Reynolds. "This will generously help our efforts to assist these children and we are so thankful to be partners with this great event."

The remaining proceeds of the event are used to help local high school seniors with graduation needs. "This year (2024) we were able to help a student who missed the enrollment period for free lunch at their school. This student was not going to be able to participate in graduation ceremonies," added Mangold. "The graduate had a bill of over \$300 looming over their head and stressed about how to pay it. With the proceeds from last year's car show (2023) we were able to pay that debt and make it possible for the senior to enjoy the graduation activities."

In other business, the next agenda item concerned the council setting the tentative millage rate for Fiscal Year 2024-2025. Town Clerk Lisa Purvis advised the council that the previous millage, 3.0, would not allow the town to pay their bills. Purvis suggested a tentative rate of 3.25 mills.

Councilman Lee Pickett made a motion to keep the millage at 3.0 but failed due to no second.

"We didn't make our budget last year, so we certainly can't make it this year as things are higher," said Councilman Kenny Sims. "I suggest start at 3.25 mills and perhaps in budget talks we can lower it."

"Let's all do our due diligence on our budgets," added Councilman Jared Wollitz.

"When we do the budget, let's do just what we have to do and see," said Councilman Dallis Hunter.

Councilman Joe Michaels made a motion to set the millage at 3.25 mills and Councilman Sims seconded.

Main Rerouting project to decrease the amount price by \$500. The council approved the order.

The council approved the contract services agreement for Joel Hall, P.E., to perform Public Works related services through September 30, 2024.

The council approved the position process for Kimberly Corbett to transition into the Lead Administrative Assistant position effective August 5,

The council approved the position process for Alicai Head to transition to the Public Information Officer & Events Coordinator position effective September 3, 2024 and she will also transfer to the Parks & Recreation Annex building, once the office is ready.

In closing comments, Councilman Sims added, "I know everyone hates tax increases, and we do too. We're in hopes it will be under! We have lots of manholes to repair. The one on Pine Street costs over \$200,000 to repair. That was a blow to the budget."

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, August 15 at 7 p.m.



The Importance of an Emergency Fund

Life can be hard sometimes. Things that happen can send our routine of life totally upside down within minutes. For instance, someone close to me recently had emergency surgery to save her life from a huge, impending aneurism.

This surprising circumstance hit her out of left field, unexpectedly. While it affected her physically and emotionally, thankfully it was not financially devastating. According to Dave Ramsey, "One of the main causes of bankruptcy is from medical bills." I would like us to avoid that statistic.

Having a fully funded emergency fund helps ease the pain a little when the important questions begin swirling around in your head like, "How am I going to pay my bills?" or "How am I going to feed my family?"

If you have a six-month emergency fund then you have a little breathing room to regain your composure, thoughts, life, stability, and plan! The person that is close to me that had the aneurism medically fixed was prepared financially. It was hard enough for her to deal with her new normal, moreover, thankfully she did not have to worry about paying her bills.

How to determine what you need in your emergency fund? Add up all your monthly expenses (mortgage, utilities, insurance, etc.) and multiply that number times six to calculate the amount of money you need for a fully funded emergency fund.

Three jump-start thoughts: Open a separate savings account for your



emergency fund. 2. Immediately budget to put aside a percentage of each paycheck into your emergency fund. 3. Use this money only for emergencies. If you need to use some of this money, replenish it as soon as possible.

Reaching the goal: 1. Beginner's \$1,000 Emergency fund: If you set aside \$19.25 a week then by the end of twelve months, you will have \$1,001 2. Date savings method: You save the amount of money that is the same as the date of the month. For example, on the 1st you put aside \$1. On the 2nd you put aside \$2. On the 3rd you put aside \$3. Carry this continual financial thought out for the entire month. For the month that is a total savings of \$496. At the end of the twelve months, you will have \$5,952.

May the Lord bless you as you begin to save. It is not easy, but it is worth it!

Apprenticeship Program Earns Award



The Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) is pleased to announce that Nassau County has been selected for NACo's Personnel Management, Employment and Training Award for its Nassau County Equipment Operator Apprenticeship Program. Since 1970, the National Association of Counties (NACo) has recognized outstanding government programs and services. Each year, NACo seeks nominations on a variety of categories that cover a vast range of county responsibilities.

This Nassau County Operator Apprenticeship Program was created in 2021 in an effort to recruit and retain high caliber employees in a competitive job market. The program was designed to provide Road Department employees with a clear, defined career path upon beginning their employment, and to provide an avenue to increase their skillset through training. A three-year Equipment Operator Apprenticeship Program was developed to train the employees on the safe and efficient operation of small equipment, heavy trucks and heavy equipment. Their first step in the program is obtaining a Class "A" Commercial Driver's License, followed by learning all aspects of the Road Department to become a highly valued Equipment Operator.

Since implementing the Program, the Road Department's vacancy rate has decreased from nearly 36% to less than 10%.

Additionally, the County has added 23 Class A CDL holders and increased the number of Equipment Operator 2 positions from four to eight, providing additional opportunities for advancement as employees complete

the Apprenticeship Program. The Program has also improved overall morale within the department because employees are given an opportunity to learn new skills and have a clear understanding on how they can advance within the department. The Apprentices receive certifications on different equipment and begin using their new skills to provide crucial maintenance services, creating additional response teams to meet the needs of the County and its residents.

Assistant Public Works Director David Hearn stated, "It has been rewarding being part of the team that planned and implemented this Apprenticeship Program. Nassau County has taken great strides to improve employee development and retention, none bigger than the Apprenticeship Program. The ability to be able to see a clear career path from day 1 of employment is instrumental in reducing the staffing shortages, as well as an accelerated promotional program to ensure our folks are receiving a competitive living wage. Providing a higher level of training to more employees has also increased the quality of work that we are able to provide, therefore providing an increased level of service to our citizens."






