## Greater Mt. Pleasant Church Celebrates 150th Anniversary


The Greater Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church in Callahan will celebrate their 150th church anniversary this Sunday, September 25. The church is located north of Callahan on US Highway 1. Organizers have planned an anniversary celebration this Sunday beginning at the 4 p.m.



The church was organized by a dedicated group of Christians in 1872. At that time, the church was called Bush Harbor Church, because the church was surrounded by bushes and trees. In 1958, the current sanctuary was built and the name of the church was changed to Greater Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church with Rev. C.W. Whitten as pastor.

In 1970, Rev. C.J. Brown was called to pastor the church. Pastor Brown served at the church from 1970 - 2009. Pastor Brown accomplished many things at the church. There were many improvements and renovations made

to the church including central heat and air; cushioned pews; electrical upgrades; a church bus and van were purchased as well as a baby Grand Hammond piano, organ etc. In 1977, the Educational Building was built and named after the late Deacon Robert Denefield.

that first included a new roof for the sanctuary and also the Educational Building. All the electrical and lighting was upgraded, tongue & groove was added to the tall ceilings, along with new paint and carpet throughout. The pastor and church secretary's offices were completely renovated,

several windows and doors replaced and the bathrooms upgraded. The sanctuary is a beauty to behold.

The church has grown several ministries throughout its tenure. They offer a scholarship ministry each year offering a scholarship to local students. Their clergy ministry has produced many great pastors that have gone on to share the gospel around the nation.

Pastor Edwards has been at the church for 81/2 years. He is beyond

excited to be a part of this special anniversary. "I am personally grateful to have the opportunity to pastor a church with such a rich history," said Pastor Edwards. ## Hilliard Man Charged with Murder

According to the Nassau County Sheriff's Office, a Hilliard man, Michael Williams, 36, was arrested and accused of shooting a man in the head and fleeing the scene in Callahan early Sunday morning. NCSO deputies were dispatched to a call about someone shot shortly after midnight Saturday. During

the investigation, deputies learned an argument broke out at a small gathering at a home on Woodridge Drive, resulting in several people leaving the residence. The owners asked Williams to leave the

According to deputies, Williams left the home but returned through the



backdoor later that day armed with a handgun. Williams shot two people several times, punched a woman in the face and a man was shot in the head twice, which caused a fatal injury.

Williams fled the scene in a 1997 Dodge Dakota pickup truck and threw the gun away, according to

deputies. NCSO found Williams in an apartment at Testone Lane in Hilliard. He was arrested and taken into custody.

Williams was charged with Murder; Attempted Murder, Armed Burglary, and Tampering and Destroying Evidence. He was booked into the Nassau County Detention Facility.



The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final regular meeting of September. The first order of business was a Public Hearing and First Reading to set the millage rate for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Ordinance 2022-06 was approved on first reading to adopt a millage rate of 3.000, which is a 29.92% increase over the roll back rate.

A Public Hearing and First Reading were also held for the budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Ordinance 2022-07 was approved with a total budget of \$9,437,607.00 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The Second and Final Reading and Public Hearing for both ordinances will be Monday, October 3 at 7 p.m.

In other business, the council approved a CDBG Water Main Change Order No. 6 for a price increase of \$10,570. The contractor has provided documentation to support the change.

2022-12, Resolution which concerned the permitting of a Homecoming Parade for Hilliard High School on Friday, September 30, was approved by the council.

The next agenda item included the approval of a payable for Jordan and Family Construction, LLC for \$1,800 for the Walker Street Drainage and Paving project.

The final item concerned a resident with a request. John Russell, who lives on Walker Street, requested to grant a permanent easement on his property to allow access to the town sewer lines. The council advised Town Attorney Christian Waugh to draw up the proper legal document to support the request of Mr. Russell for approval as soon as possible.

The next regular meeting of the council will be held Thursday, October 6 at 7 p.m.

Truth. What is truth? Have you ever asked this question before? If you have, you are not the first and you will not be the last. Pilate asked this question of Jesus in John 19:38. What is truth? Pilate asked this question of Jesus not because he cherished truth, but because he wanted to dismiss the truth. Truth cannot be dismissed. Truth will not go away. The question of truth will always be one of the most important questions that one could ever ask. A simple definition of truth is this: truth is what accurately corresponds to reality. All of us

need to know what truth is. There is no such thing as your truth, there is simply truth. Truth by its very nature will always be narrow, restrictive and absolute.

Truth will always be narrow, because there are not multiple realities. There is one reality. There is one accurate correspondence to reality. Every other understanding of ultimate reality is in error. Truth will also be unchanging. If truth could be changed at a later point and time, it would have been truth in the first place. Truth does not have the ability to change. It may take time for us to understand truth, but truth does not change. Truth is not something that we come up with, truth originates with God. I am not omniscient. I am bound by time. I am not the arbiter of reality. Only God is.

Tragically, truth has disappeared from many in public discourse and ethical decision making. What has replaced truth? Emotion and feelings. Listen to people talk. Whenever they speak about anything at all, there is no appeal to reason or truth. This non-sense has been put on display for all to see. When someone speaks about the truth of anything, nobody wants to hear it. They get mad at the truth teller and tell them that they lack empathy or compassion. Believing truth and speaking truth makes you a bad person. This is not a caricature of what is happening today, this is the new normal. In our culture, feelings matter more than truth. This is chaos. The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their final meeting of September. Joe Clark representing the Red Cross approached the podium. "I just wanted to come and introduce myself to the council as I am the Disaster Program Manager for the NE FL Region, which includes Callahan," said Clark. "We want to be present in this community and make ourselves known and what we do. We are a disaster team for house fires, flooding, hurricane/tornado damage, etc. We want to help get Callahan disaster ready. We are always looking for volunteers to join our team. I'll leave some literature with the clerk for more information."

The first and second agenda items concerned Public Hearings and Second and Final Readings. Resolution 2022-

R10 concerned setting the millage rate at 2.0896 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Resolution 2022-R11 concerned setting the Budget at \$12,501,340.00 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

The council approved both resolutions.

In other business, the council also approved Resolution 2022-R12, which concerned donating \$2,000 to the West Nassau Historical Society to assist with the Callahan Christmas parade.

The council also authorized the mayor to sign the Department of Economic Opportunity grant agreement for \$4 million. The money will go towards the Crawford Diamond water extension project.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, October 3 at 7 p.m.

## Former Callahan Sports Association President Arrested for Fraud

According to Nassau County Sheriff's Office reports, the NCSO was contacted regarding a fraud report for the Callahan Sports Association. According to the complainant, the CSA was approximately



\$40,000 short of what they should be. The majority of the association's transactions occur through Square, Inc. and the Square account was only accessible by Bennie Clements, the CSA former president. The complainant and other CSA members questioned Clements about the account and missing money. Clements claimed he was unsure what happened and didn't have access to the account. A few days

later Clements gave the complainant

access to a Square account but it was

a newly created account and also had a

new email address for the account.

NCSO sent a request to the State Attorney's Office regarding Square account. The deputy requested the name and address of the subscriber as well as the billing address and other pertinent information. Following

much more investigation and 13 days later, Clements was arrested.

Based on the investigation, Bennie Alvin Clements, Jr. engaged in a systematic, ongoing course of conduct with intent to defraud (scheme to defraud) the Callahan Sports Association and thereby obtained \$22,414.01 that was supposed to go to the CSA for various football and cheer registrations. On September 15, 2022, Bennie Alvin Clements, Jr., 56, of Callahan, was arrested and charged with Organized Fraud Over \$20,000.

## Operation Keystroke... 11 Arrested

Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper held a press conference last Wednesday with the results of Operation Keystroke, a 4-day operation. The operation was held with NCSO, FDLE, FBI, Fernandina Beach Police Department, State Attorney's office and many other agencies. "This was a huge operation with lots of help from other agencies to coordinate everything. This was the first time that we (NCSO) have held one of these operations," said Leeper. "My hope was that we wouldn't catch anyone. Well, we did. And this will not be our last operation."

Sheriff Leeper then went through each of the arrested with a little background from each:

Richard Capra, 43, Yulee, thought he was traveling to have sex with a 14-year-old; career criminal and was released from Florida State Prison after burglary and another crime.

Tavarris Andrews, 31, Lehigh Acres, FL, Captain in the US Army, stationed at West Point Military Academy, wanted to have sex with 14-year-old.

Justin Campbell, 33, Woodbine, solicited 14-year-old child for sex and wanted naked pictures of child.

Sprite Poleski, 19, Jacksonville, admitted to soliciting minor for sex acts. Said if he had met her in person, he would discourage her from arranging online meetings to have sex, also deputies found 120 grams of marijuana inside his car.

Charles McPhail, 24, Jacksonville, wanted to have sex with 14-year-old.

Baraka Johnson, 25, Jacksonville,

wanted to have sex with 14-year-old, as well as with multiple other people "taking turns on her," also had 17.3 grams of marijuana in his possession.

Khalil Nether, 26, Sumner, GA, wanted to have sex with 14-year-old, traveled to undercover location to have sex.

Antonio Morales, 30, Jacksonville, wanted to have sex with 14-year-old, also charged with 6 counts of child porn on his phone.

Carlos James, 34, Jacksonville, thought he was communicating with mom of 13-year-old. When he was told girl was 13 he said he was okay with that.

Jeremy Kinsey, 30, Jacksonville, communicated online for sex.

Jeffrey Burrell, Fort Myers; "This is a picture of a dirty old man," said Leeper of Burrell. He wanted to pay 14-year-old girl to perform sex acts on him in car, also wanted to know if she was too young for marijuana. He is a law enforcement officer at Lee County Port Authority Police Department. He retired after 31 years of service as a law enforcement officer in Quincy, MA.

"Participating in this operation helps me realize we are saving children's lives. There are monsters out there that are looking for your children. Where ever you are, we (NCSO) will find you," added Leeper. "To parents, you can't be naïve about what your children are doing on their phones or the internet. Get in your child's business. It's your responsibility."







## Flashes Stung in a Heartbreaker

Fresh off a dominant performance in their rebound game against Paxon, the Hilliard Flashes returned to the confines of Flashes Field to kick off a four-game home stretch. They began the stretch with an opponent they know all too well in the Lafayette Mayo Hornets. The

Flashes came into this game winning the last two matchups against the Hornets, including a low-scoring 22-21 thriller at home in the 2020 playoffs.

The question remained; can the Flashes keep the streak going? The Flashes began the contest with the ball but their progress would be stalled as the Hornets defense forced a turnover. The Hornets offense set up shop at the Flashes 44-yard line and used their ground game to generate a competent drive. Their efforts were rewarded as the Hornets took the read option pitch towards the left side for a 17-yard



The second half produced a third quarter dominated by the Hornets. They used their potent rushing attack to generate back-

to-back scoring drives. One with a 4-yard rushing touchdown, and the other from 2-yards out. With the extra point good on both scores, the Hornets widened their lead to 21-6 to close out the quarter. The Flashes began their march to get back into the game when Lyle Bennett dropped a dime into the waiting hands of Nathaniel Vroman for a 27-yard touchdown pass. With the 2-point conversion attempt good, the Flashes cut the deficit down to 21-14. After the defense forced a punt, the Flashes offense got the ball back with the chance to tie the game. They drove down the field and were on their way to convert a crucial 4th and 5, but the Hornets defense rose up and stopped



the drive with another fumble recovery. The Flashes were given one last chance to tie the game after Avera blocked a punt that was recovered by Brandon Matthews at the Hornets' 25 yard line. The Hornets defense sealed the game with a late interception and the Flashes lost in heartbreaking fashion with the final score being 21-14.

Offensively, the Flashes produced 224 yards of total offense while committing 3 turnovers. Bennett went 8/14 for 95 yards, a touchdown, and an interception on the night; Avera led the ground game with 19 carries for 87 yards and a touchdown; Braydon Holley had 12 carries for 41 yards and 4 catches for 21 yards; Vroman led the team in receptions with 3 catches for 67 yards and a score; and Prestin O'Quinn had a catch for 7 yards. Colton Conner led the Flashes defense with 8 tackles and 5 solos; Billy Moore had 6 tackles; Brogan Johns and Klayton Bright both had 5 tackles with Johns recorded a pass breakup; and Damon Kibler and Matthews each had 4 tackles.

This Friday night, the Flashes welcome the Crescent City Raiders to Flashes Field with a 7 p.m. kickoff!
