OCTOBER & THE ROSARY

"The Rosary is the 'weapon' for these times." -Saint Padre Pio

According to catholicculture.org, "The month of **OCTOBER** is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7. The feasts in October also include two of the most popular, time-honored devotions of Catholics, the devotion to the Holy Rosary (October 7) and the Guardian Angels (October 2).



In October 2002, St. John Paul II wrote the Apostolic Letter, "Rosarium Virginis Mariae (the Rosary of the Virgin Mary)". This letter introduced five new mysteries, called the Luminous or Mysteries of Light, which are: 1. Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan, 2. Jesus' self manifestation at the wedding of Cana, 3. Proclamation of the Kingdom of God, with the call to conversion, 4. the Transfiguration, and 5. the Institution of the Eucharist.

Every person has a guardian angel assigned to them, and October 2 the Church celebrates the role of these Guardian Angels. We should show devout gratitude to God for placing these angels at our service. Having a guardian should give us confidence during all of life's difficulties. Every Catholic should know the *Angele Dei* (Angel of God) prayer and pray it often. The *Directory on Popular Piety* suggests that families pray it at morning and evening prayers or after the Angelus."
