The remaining days of December mark the beginning of the **Christmas** season. The liturgical color changes to white or gold — a symbol of joy, purity and innocence. The month of December is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception." (catholicculture.org)



The Meaning of the Four **ADVENT CANDLES**. According to dynamiccatholic.com, "The Third Week of Advent - Candle Name: *the Shepherd's Candle*, Represents: *Joy*, Candle Color: *Pink*. This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the

shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus." Let us light our two purple and the pink candles!
