Tomorrow, August 22, we commemorate **THE QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY!**

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.



In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

What is a DEACON? “Deacons share in Christ’s mission and grace in a special way. The call to diaconal service is a gift of the Spirit to the Church. Deacon Formation is the process for discerning whether or not a particular person has these gifts of Christ-like charity and service.” *“Men who are ordained to the permanent diaconate promise to live out the charism of service to God, and to the people of God through a life of ordained ministry. This commitment is characterized by service to the Word of God, to the Sacraments of the Church, and to a life of Heroic Charity. The role of the deacon is to be a helper of the bishops and priests. He is to proclaim by his life the Church’s call to serve the needs of others: to proclaim the Gospel message, to live a life of fidelity to Christ and the Church, and to lead the community in building a Kingdom of grace, faith, justice, and compassion. The deacon is to be a sign and a living witness of the presence of Christ the Servant in the world.”* “Here in the Diocese of Belleville, we facilitate this process through a 5-year program of human, spiritual, doctrinal, and pastoral formation. It is a 5-year program through the St. Meinrad School of Theology. Classes are held at the Diocesan Pastoral Center at 2620 Lebanon Avenue, Belleville. The first year of formation is known as aspirancy and consists of one-day workshops held once a month. Following aspirancy, the next four years are more demanding, involving one weekend per month (Friday evenings, all day Saturday, and Sunday mornings) for academic studies.” (<https://www.diobelle.org/canonical-affairs/permanent-diaconate>).
