Words from our Pastor

Live Nativity: Thanks to all who helped make the Live Nativity a success. Special thanks to Esther for managing the costumes, Kathy for the hot chocolate, and John R. with the sound and video. Thank God for the great weather too; one little shower.

From the Council: The Council met on December 17th. We appreciate the support from the Congregation for the 2024 Budget recognizing there are some significant increases. We also appreciate your support for the election of Claire and Rhoda as our new Council members. The first meeting of the new Council will be on January 28th where we will elect new officers and adjust our ministry team liaison assignments.

At the Council meeting, the Finance team made a recommendation to move money from the Wells Fargo investment account to the checking account to be available for expected endowment grants. Fifteen thousand from the Black and General endowment fund and \$10K from the Gilmore Fund. Two grants from the Black and General endowment fund were proposed. These grants are \$2K to support our 2023 commitment to the "Be the Light" campaign, and \$6K to increase our 2023 Synod support, which has been significantly below synod guidance the past several years. The grants are consistent with the terms of the Black and General endowment fund to use earnings from the fund to support specific ministries. The transfer of the Gilmore fund will be used to fund the initial engineering work on the new accessibility ramp in the Sanctuary.

We expressed appreciation for the years Cindy Milling has served on the Council. Thank you for your service, Cindy!

Our Council retreat is scheduled for February 24th at Twin Lakes. Ted will be asking the Synod for assistance providing a facilitator for the retreat.

"Be the Light" Campaign: It is apparent we need to help the Congregation have a better understanding of what Lutheran Services Carolina is wanting to achieve with this campaign. The focus is on helping brain injured individuals in our communities, many of whom are veterans, by providing seed money to expand services. We will be providing more information soon. From the Finance Team: Through November 2023, total General Fund Giving YTD was \$161,613. Operation Expenses YTD were \$196,289. Loss YTD is \$34,677. We anticipate our year end deficit to be about \$40,000, which can be covered with tower fund revenue.

As we look around at each other, there is no question we are an aging congregation. Generous donors in the past have provided ALC endowment funds and property that surrounds our church. Are you thinking about the legacy you can provide to ALC in the future just as those generous donors have done in the past?

Our three-year goal is to double the number of active participants at ALC on a regular basis. It is important for us to welcome new members to support and grow our ministries and share our financial needs. Expenses are increasing for maintenance and improvements to our facilities, insurance, salaries and benefits, and last but not least, expanding our ministries.

From the Christian Education and Youth Team:

We hope to have candidates attend The National Youth Gathering in 2024. The Bishop and Synod have an ambitious plan to raise funds to support sending youth to the gathering next year.

We are also looking for unused musical instruments you might have tucked away in the attic, garage, or closet. If you have any you are willing to part with, we believe they can be part of a future youth ministry. Talk to Ted if you have something to donate.

From Evangelism/Social Ministry: Our Christmas

Although some of our regulars were missing for the Lunch Bunch gathering in our Fellowship Hall in December, we had a good turnout. Sitting around the tables so we could see each other provided great fellowship. The fried chicken from Lowes Foods was delicious as were the variety of sides provided by participants. We will be doing it again! In the meantime, the next lunch bunch will be at Mellow Mushroom, 767 Huffman Mill Road, Burlington, on **January 11**th at 11:30. Come and join us!

The Blessing Box outdoor food pantry has been installed. Thanks to Tony Lewis, with help from our new Girl Scout Troop, it has been built and delivered. Many folks helped to make this a reality. Food has already been placed in the box, even without any signage. Pastor John and Rhoda have received a Thrivent grant for initial stocking of the pantry. Katie and Roy used a Thrivent grant from 2023 to help with building supplies and will apply for another grant to cover further stocking of the pantry this year. If you would like to donate unexpired, nonperishable food items to the Blessing Box, they are welcome. Lynn will provide more information to the congregation about what we would like the pantry to be stocked with. More canned goods in the colder months, other nonperishable foods in the warmer months.

Our next "Because of You..." potluck luncheon will be held on **January 21st** following church with a presentation from Kelli Stutts, Founder and Executive Director at Connect4Faith. Connect4Faith is an Alamance County organization whose mission is to "*Prevent child sexual abuse, exploitation, and sex trafficking through providing knowledge, resources, awareness and action.*" Connect4Faith has been using office space at the church for the past year.

Visit the ALC website to see the improvements. One area of emphasis right now is ensuring that our <u>church calendar</u> is up to date. More and

more people are making use of our space (that's a good thing), but it also means we must be careful about not overbooking. If you are planning on using any space for an event or meeting, please let Marty know so that she can make sure it is added to the calendar.

From Worship and Music: We have greatly enhanced our online streaming technology. Have you tried it out? We now can provide a high-quality experience when folks cannot be present for worship. (It is better if you come and be physically present, not just for you, for all of us and our faith community.) John R. is looking to train some additional operators for the system.

The new system allows direct streaming to Facebook Live. You do not need a Facebook account to access the live stream on Facebook. Just go to the Facebook website.

We had a great turnout for the Christmas Eve service. Over seventy-five attendees. Matt also did a great job providing special music for the program.

From the Cemetery Team: All residents are resting peacefully. If you are a voting member or an immediate family member of a voting member, you qualify for a free space in ALC's cemetery or memorial garden. Let Pastor Ron know if you are interested.

From the Hospitality Team: We plan to support the January 21st "Because of You..." luncheon. Goodies are being provided

in the Gathering Space for some social time following our services. Thanks to Kathy and Cindy for the work they are doing.

The next Red Cross Blood Drive will be February 9th from 12:30-5:30pm. You can already sign up online. The last two drives have been very successful. ALC is a great location and has developed a group of "regular givers".

From the Stewardship Team: The team did not meet in December but has already begun planning an exciting new initiative for 2024. Stay tuned.

From the Property Team: The trees are gone! Thanks to the lumberjacks that removed them and all the debris. It really clears the front of the church.

Engineering studies are underway on the new ramp proposal in the Sanctuary. We shared the concept with you at the December congregation meeting. The ramp is a first step. Our longer-term goal is for an elevator from the Fellowship Hall to the upper levels of our building.

Generous donors have provided funds for improvements to our facilities and for improved sound systems. John R. has provided the Council with proposals for the improved sound systems in the Sanctuary and the Chapel. We are truly blessed with generous anonymous donors. **Fall Festival:** We are looking for someone to step up and lead the planning for our Festival in 2024.
