

RESEARCH INDICATES

- 50% of Retirement
 Communities allow Bring Your
 Own (BYO)
 - This is sometimes in conjunction with a liquor license



RESEARCH INDICATES

- 95% are serving complimentary alcoholic beverages on occasion
 - With meals
 - During special events

COMMUNITY CULTURE

- Community Culture should be respected
- Full Pub operations may not fit for all
- Those communities for which a licensed Pub is not appropriate may still find it beneficial to provide Happy Hours, Wine and Cheese events, and allow BYO





- If the community wants to <u>s ell</u> alcoholic beverages, a license must be obtained
- Licenses are obtained from the governing municipality, so can vary not only from state to state, but from town to town.
- Complimentary alcoholic beverages typically do not require a license
- A BYOB license may be required
- BYOB and sold beverages may be restricted

Brown-Bagging Permit

A brown-bagging permit authorizes each individual patron of an establishment, with the permission of the permittee, to bring up to eight liters of fortified wine or spirituous liquor, or eight liters of the two combined, onto the premises and to consume those alcoholic beverages on the premises. The permit fee is \$400.00 and may be issued for any of the following:

- If you are allowing BYO currently, will it be permitted with a formal license?
- How will residents react if they forfeit BYO privileges?
- Corkage Can you charge?


- Requirements and classifications vary by state, even locality

- Servers must be over 18, even to clear tables where alcohol was served








