

#### The Word from the Bridge Pastor

"Train yourself in godliness, for, while physical training is of some value, godliness is valuable in every way, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and struggle, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially those who believe." (1 Timothy 4:7b-10).

A couple of years ago I was getting really out of shape. I knew that I needed to exercise, and at my wife Sara's persistent urging I enrolled in a fitness class at the YWCA. For twelve weeks, twice a week, I met with a fitness trainer and the rest of the class.

Initially, I felt conspicuous finding myself in such a group. But one thing quickly became clear. All of us needed to be there. We were all out of shape and it was affecting our lives. The trainer showed us a series of exercises each day, which all felt extremely awkward doing, and looked even more awkward. But being in a group made me feel much less conspicuous. We all started small, encouraged each other, and called each other to task. By the end of the time I knew some gym people, I felt like I had some idea of what I was doing, and felt as if I belonged there. I was also more fit, knew I felt better, and sometimes even looked forward to the gym. With that beginning I continued working out with whoever was there when I showed up. In time I mentioned my workouts

in passing to a friend, and he asked me if I would help him get started. I invited him to come with me, and soon the gym was a place he felt good about himself and at home.

I think this is what Paul is getting at in his first letter to the younger Timothy, when he says, "*Train your-self in godliness*." When we exercise some measure of discipline to our spiritual life it can be that part of our lives where we experience harmony and satisfaction no matter what goes on around us, and what's more a part of our life that begins now and will continue in God's presence after this life is over.

The concept is simple enough — "Just Do It" — but the whole matter seems intimidating, not least admitting our unfaithfulness. We can leave our spiritual stagnation unaddressed, but I urge you to enrolled in the spiritual fitness class of your choice, whether it is Bible Study, hymn singing, worship, volunteering, or prayer. You may find yourself out of your familiar, comfort zone, but you will be among friends.

Initially, we may feel conspicuous, but it quickly becomes clear that we all need to be there. Most of us are spiritually out of shape, and it affects our lives. The exercises of prayer, reading scripture, mutual encouragement, Holy Communion, etc, may even feel awkward. But being in the company of believers will make us feel far less conspicuous. When we start small, encourage each other, and called each other to task we will grow in God's presence. And soon we will all know that we belong among God's people, in his presence. We will feel more hopeful, have improved resources for dealing with the struggles of daily life, and look forward to coming into God's presence in prayer, worship, and service. In time we may mention our faith in passing to a friend and they may ask if we will help them get started, and soon God's Holy Church and people can be a place where more and more folks feel at home and good about themselves and the God who loves us all.

#### **Love Notes**

The Gloria Dei building that has served our spiritual needs, and been the center of our spiritual life IS STILL HERE. The joys and sorrows of family events, baptisms, weddings and funerals, are all major parts of life as Christians. Here, we have studied God's Word, offered Him our prayers and praise in worship, and received our Lord's very Body and Blood through the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

However, in what appeared like a few moments, all that seemed to change. Anger and confusion with no place to put them. Questions which had no answers. Isaiah speaks about "grass withering" where there is nothing left. Some of us felt like that.

Realization sets in, all of a sudden you realize that our building still stands. The Word of God is still preached. We are still able to meet with supporting fellowship and God is ever present here!

We have suffered a loss in a way. What hope, what comfort is there for us? The Bible is full of hope, here is one. "We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him...." (Isaiah). So where is the comfort? Loss of a pastor, an aging building and congregation? Sounds negative to me. That cannot be, as <u>God is not negative</u>, therefore we must re-think some of the words – in everything and "works for good." We have been doing that over many months. Thoughts, a lot of prayers, and some arguing. The task is great but only because we are charged with a directive from God about being good stewards of our assets in the process of spiritual advancement for ourselves ,and, any who would hear our messages of the power and glory of God. In essence we are an infant church with traditions of yore. Oliver Lodge tells us, "Never throw away hastily any old faith, tradition or convention. They may require modification, but they are the result of the experience of many generations."

It is true that prayer brings the omnipotent God to work for us. Prayer does change things. We need to do our part in this 'church rebuilding'. God said to Moses, "Why do you cry for me? Tell the children of Israel to go forward." (Exodus 14) God is not going to do our walking for us; He has given us two legs and two hands and intellect enough to do the job. Trusting in God for direction, we are able to go forward. "God gives every bird its food; but He does not throw it in the nest." (Hilland)

Chosen by God for this new life of love in deciding how best to serve our God, put on your best wardrobe: Compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength, and discipline. Be even-tempered, especially when others become agitated; this is a must: forgive the offense quickly. It is your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it. #### Sharing is Caring — Food and Clothing Bank

Story from a Lutheran digest: The father was waiting at the bus stop for his son, coming home after 12 years in the city. He recalled the very few details he had. The condo turned into apartments, raised rent, thievery, and finally the building set on fire with his remaining goods inside. Overnight staying at costly motels, then cheap rooms where his belongings were often stolen; working daily but the wage did not pay for any of the services and finally loss of his long time held job. He was homeless. A missionary found him and in conversation they shared, the son was given a bus ticket home. The father sees the passengers depart from the bus, but no son. The only person was a straggly haired, extremely thin person wearing clean but shabby clothing. Father gave a quick blessing to him, continued looking for his son. It was then he realized that this lonely figure was HIS SON. The true story was long, so I paraphrased it. Sometimes it is hard to remember that the homeless belong to someone, and bad things just happen.

#### Proposed Lease Agreement (reprinted from May)

Bruce Barker, our commercial broker, has presented a draft lease document for our review. The council received copies of the document for consideration, comments, suggestions etc. The document details the terms of the lease, specific requirements for both parties, timelines, use agreements and much more. There are 37 pages and a significant amount is "Boiler Plate", and used in standard leases. However, each detail must be evaluated and any questions or concerns addressed. Once we have the final version of the lease, we will have our Property Attorney's Office review and provide a response prior to signing the lease. The basics of the lease are:

- \$8,000 a month for the entire Education Wing
  of our building, which encompasses both the
  upstairs and downstair, which includes the
  kitchen, and social hall. We have verbally been
  told we can use the kitchen and social hall on
  Sunday's and for Advent and Lent services and
  soup suppers. We have asked for that confirmation in writing, which may require an addendum to the lease document.
- 1st term of lease is five years from commencement with an option for 2 more five year leases. Commencement date is still being discussed.

We have also verbally been told the security at Life Center will also patrol our property and provide the landscaping maintenance for the entire Gloria dei campus. We have also sent a question about wear and tear on parking lot during construction, and potential problems with only one way in and out drop off/pick up area on the eastside etc. We will update everyone as new information from Bruce is received and or new questions come from other members. You can email the church office at gloriadeilutherantacoma@gmail.com, call and leave a message on the church phone or drop the question off at church. Pastor is around quite a bit, there is usually some folks there on Wednesdays from 2:00 to 5:00 and Judy is there on Thursdays and Fridays from 1:00 to 3:00. If you want a paper copy of the lease document, please let Pastor or Vickie know and they will get you one.
