

**EATON TOWNSHIP
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MONTHLY MEETING
July 6, 2021**

The regular monthly meeting of the Eaton Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman White on Tuesday July 6, 2021.

Present were, Chairman Kenny White, Supervisor Abe Kukuchka, Supervisor/Road Master Paul Rowker, Secretary Jennifer Harvey, and residents Lance Montross, Bill Faux, Jean McGavin, Jane Hefford and Norm Kelly.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

VISITORS AND GUESTS:

Norm Kelly brought to concerns of rumors upsetting the Eaton Hills neighborhood concerning the new Weis developers plans for water and sewer. Supervisor Kukuchka added that Triton Fire Co. already approved the proposed hydrant. Supervisor Rowker assured him that Corby would see to it next week, with repairs in the spring.
