EATON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONTHLY MEETING June 6, 2023

The regular monthly meeting of the Eaton Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Kenny White on Tuesday, June 6, 2023.

Present were Chairman Kenny White, Supervisor Robert Pitcavage, and Supervisor Abe Kukuchka.

Minutes from the previous meeting were distributed in draft form. With no corrections needed, Supervisor Kukuchka made a motion to accept the minutes, seconded by Supervisor Pitcavage.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

The financial report was accepted as positive.

ZONING OFFICER REPORT:

Mr. Patton shared the Zoning Officers report. Four permits were issued- a demo, rebuild, remodel and food truck. Issues with strip mall in front of Walmart are being addressed. Geisinger will be submitting a sign proposal. Eaton Water and Sewer is concerned with the demand from Geisinger will affect capacity. Mr. Pitcavage noted that it is up to DEP. Mr. Patton said that a category 4 sewer approval is needed and that Eaton Water and Sewer will have to sign off. Discussion continued on Geisinger and how the Moose Lodge's right of way could be affected- since it was granted just a temporary right of way when Aldi was constructed. Mr. White noted that American Asphalt was looking for boundaries in the lot. Also- the water was shut off to the new strip mall – because they had no power- an unknown actor turned it back on.

VISITORS AND GUESTS:

Lori Bennet attended.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Master's Concrete DEP matter was just a renewal. Solar signs should begin installation soon. Randy Weirnusz helped with dust control- a load will be delivered on Thursday. Chairman White added that McMullian would get a light coat- previous to the FDR project.

NEW BUSINESS:

Solicitor Sheils was to attend to speak on eliminating the personal tax- as he did not show- an email will be sent seeking information. The Seneca Park sign was discussed. Mr. Patton will grant a permit and review the sign's size and placement. Assessor's changes were reviewed. Ms. Bennet explained that the township can request school bus stop signs from TASD. It was decided to purchase a subscription to the paper. Mr. Pitcavage attended the Municipal Summit and reported that items of note were the DUNS number, solar farm zoning- which Mr. Patton said that Carson had drafted an ordinance- and that Susquehanna County will pay for EMT classes for those will sign on with them. There will be a special meeting on the 19th to open FDR bids. The county will provide \$3, 995.32 from the liquid fuels fund. Mr. Pitcavage noted that the probation officer would provide prisoners for projects. After discussing our vs the county's recycling program- Chairman White concluded that it was more convenient as single stream recycling for the residents.

Checks were signed.

Meeting was adjourned at 8 pm by Chairman White, second by Supervisor Kukuchka.
