EATON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONTHLY MEETING September 7, 2022

The regular monthly meeting of the Eaton Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman White on Wednesday, September 7, 2022.

Present were, Chairperson Kenny White and Robert Pitcavage; Supervisor Abe Kukuchka was absent.

Minutes from the previous meeting were distributed in draft form. With no corrections needed, Supervisor White made a motion to accept the minutes, seconded by Supervisor Pitcavage.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

The report was approved by Chairman White. Treasurer Patton shared details of the transfer of Seneca Trail Park funds to the County, totaling 3,993.00. The Township spent more this month for stone- Mr. White noted that it had been two years since some roads were touched.

ZONING OFFICER REPORT:

Mr. Patton reported a busy month. Permits were issued to several residents as well as the Ford dealership, and Camp Onawandah. Two sewage permits were also issued. The Dymond Terrace resident received a certified letter as per our attorney's instruction. Follow up is contingent upon the resident's further action. The previous T-Town shed property is being pursued by a potential buyer. It is in a Rural-Agricultural area less than 300 feet from a residence; principal permits will need to be granted. A concerned resident pointed out that Creekside Gardens farmer market may impede ambulance access.

VISITORS AND GUESTS:

Sergeant Maciw from the State Police gave a report on activity in the township. While criminal incidents were low and mainly focused at Walmart, car crashes are relatively high, with 52 this year so far, but no fatalities. It was also noted that Automart uses the turning lane for off loading vehicles. Chairman White thanked the officer for everything they do.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The radar signs were delivered, and need to be installed. Pest control and carpet cleaning were completed. The Bridge light project was reviewed. Chairman White approved of the design and the inclusion of flag/ banner poles.

NEW BUSINESS:

The surface mining permit was reviewed. The minor subdivision for Geisinger was approved by the county. Supervisor Pitcavage added the they would need to change use for flow. Notification of well drilling in Washington Township was reviewed. DCED Block Grant applications are available to address blighted properties- Supervisor Pitcavage will seek further information. Supervisor Pitcavage was approved to sign checks.

Checks were signed.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:18 by Supervisor White, seconded by Supervisor Pitcavage
