

**Eaton Township Supervisors
June 2, 2026
Meeting Minutes**

Call to Order

Mr. Patton called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Attendance

In attendance were Jim Greenley, Chad Patton and Bob Pitcavage, Diana Patton, Angela Tuttle, Kevin Bohnenberger, Anna Clate, Richard Miller, Raymond Phillips, Jason Racht, Gwen Kovolenus, Adam & Denise Robinson and Sherrie Teabo.

Audience Participation

Adam Robinson commented on road line painting. Mr. Patton is currently reaching out for bids for a single line on Frear Hill. Residence from Diamond Terrace as well as other locations, voiced their concerns over the train noise that happens all night long. Mr. Pitcavage commented that he spoke with Matt Johnson, in charge of government affairs, to voice concerns with the noise when they first started the work last year. However, there were no changes. Mr. Patton commented that the work was to be done by 5/24/2026 and railroad ties must be replaced during the day and therefore the other work has to be done at night. Mr. Pitcavage and Ms. Tuttle will work together with the county commissioners to see what else can be done. Residence also brought up the issue of installing a red light at Weis entrance but this is decided by PennDot, not Eaton township. Mr. Patton also brought up the issue of the sand trucks parking and idling in the parking lot a Geisinger /Burger King.

Zoning Report

The Ford Dealership has applied to install solar panels on the building roof. Mr. Patton made the motion to accept the Zoning Report, Mr. Pitcavage seconded – all in favor – motion carried

Road Report

Ms. Tuttle reported they continue to do grading, rolling, dust control (with calium), a driveway pipe on East Montross was replaced and provided a reminder of Clean-up day on June 6 from 8 am to 12 pm. Dumpsters will be delivered Friday, June 5.

Mr. Patton made a motion to accept Road report, Mr. Greenley seconded - all in favor, motion carried

Correspondence

We received a document from PennDOT that they will be conducting various work on the Tunkhannock Bridge in 2027 and there will be lane closures. There is a form that is required to be filled out by June 22nd and we will need to advise Kunkle EMS in the future.

Unfinished Business

Dirt & Gravel Grant – This was submitted by Angie on 5/5/2026 but we do not have a response yet, it is due June 8th.

DCED, Strategic Performance Division – possible Grant. On-going, no deadline.

Wyoming County Twp Supervisor Convention – Business Advertisements – Mr. Pitcavage is still working on this.

Jenks Road over Marsh Creek Bridge – Mr. Patton stated that now that water levels are lower, we need to start working on this. *The far abutment footing is exposed full height from Beam 2 to Beam 9 with undermining present below Beams 4 to 9. A priority 1 recommendation is in place to underpin the Far Abutment footing and place rock along the abutment.*

Wyoming County Twp Supervisor Convention, Business Advertisement – Mr. Pitcavage will look in Tunkhannock Ford and the Jeep/Dodge dealerships in regards to placing an ad.

Vibrating Roller – An 84" roller was purchased

Clean up Day – Reminder for this Saturday, June 6th. It was asked if signs were going to be placed at the township building but per Jason, they no longer have any. The previous signs with metal stakes were trashed.

New Business

Open Crack Seal Bids – Three bids were received. **Midland Asphalt - \$25,403.00**, Suit-Kote - \$31,753.75 and Vestal Asphalt - \$21,993.65. Mr. Patton made a motion to award the bid to Midland Asphalt. Mr. Greenley seconded. All in favor – motion carried.

Approval for Bid Ad for various pending roadwork – Mr. Patton made a motion to approve newspaper ad for various road work projects. Mr. Greenley seconded - all in favor - motion carried.

Appoint members to Eaton Township Planning Commission for amending the zoning ordinance to include data center amendment – Per Mr. Patton, Ethan Greenley has resigned from the planning commission. Ms. Tuttle nominated Kevin Bohnenberger, who accepted and Anna Clate has also volunteered. Mr. Patton made a motion to appoint them to the planning commission, Mr. Pitcavage seconded – all in favor, – motion carried.

Eaton/Monroe Joint Planning commission – Mr. Pitcavage made a motion for Carson Helfich to provide planning consulting on the data centers at the meetings for \$2,375.00 based on 25hrs. This amount will be split between Monroe and Eaton townships. Mr. Patton seconded – motion approved.

Speed Humps – Documentation was provided by Mr. Pitcavage. This is tabled for a later date.

Motion to Pay Bills

Mr. Patton made a motion to pay the bills. Mr. Greenley seconded - all in favor, motion carried
