Matthew 1:6

And Jesse the father
of King David,
David was the father
of Solomon, whose
mother had been
Uriah's wife.

2 Samuel 11:1-5

In the spring, at the time when kings go off to war, David sent Joab out with the king's men and the whole Israelite army. They destroyed the Ammonites and besieged Rabbah. But David remained in Jerusalem.

One evening David got up from his bed and walked around on the roof of the palace. From the roof he saw a woman bathing.

The woman was very beautiful, and David sent someone to find out about her. The man said, “She is Bathsheba the daughter of Eliam and the wife of Uriah the Hittite.”

Then David sent messengers to get her. She came to him and he slept with her. (Now she was purifying herself from her monthly uncleanness.)

Then she went back home. The woman conceived and sent word to David saying, “I am pregnant.”

2 Samuel 11:26-27

When Uriah's wife heard that her husband was dead, she mourned for him. After the time of mourning was over, David had her brought to his house and she became his wife and bore him a son.

Each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. Then after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin and sin, when it is full grown gives birth to death.
