510 Feet long 1 1/2 Football Fields


50 Feet Tall Four story building Genesis 5:32 - Noah at 500 years old becomes a father.

When David Danced

2 Samuel 6:14-16 David danced before the Lord with all his might, wearing a priestly garment. So David and all the people of Israel brought up the Ark of the Lord with shouts of joy and the blowing of rams horns.

But as the Ark of the Lord entered the City of David, Michal, the daughter of Saul, looked down from her window. When she saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord, she was filled with contempt for him.

2 Samuel 6:20-23 She said in disgust, "How distinguished the king of Israel looked today, shameless exposing himself to the servant girls like any vulgar person might do!"

David retorted to Michal, "I was dancing before the Lord, who chose me above your father and all his family! He appointed me as the leader of Israel, the people of the Lord, so I celebrated before the Lord." "Yes, and I am wiling to look even more foolish than this, even to be humiliated in my own eyes! But those servant girls you mentioned will indeed think I am distinguished!"

So Michal, the daughter of Saul, remained childless throughout her entire life.
