Q & A with Jesus

## Luke 20:1

Now it happened on one of those days, as he taught the people in the temple and preached the gospel, that the chief priests and the scribes, together with the elders confronted Him.

Luke 20:2

“Tell us by what authority you are doing these things,” they said. “Who gave you this authority?”

## Luke 20:21-22

So the spies questioned him;

“Teacher, we know that you speak and teach what is right, and that you do not show partiality but teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. Is it right for us to pay taxes to Caesar or not?”



**“Give to Cesar what is Cesar’s and give  
to God what is God’s.”**

They were unable to trap him in what he had said there in public. And astonished by his anger, they became silent.

## Luke 20:27-33

Some of the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus with a question.

“Teacher,” they said, “Moses wrote for us that if a man’s brother dies and leaves a wife but no children, the man must marry the widow and raise up offspring for his brother.”

Now there were seven brothers.

The first one married a woman  
and died childless.

The second and the third married  
her, and in the same way the  
seven all died, leaving no  
children. Finally the woman died  
too. Now then, at the resurrection  
whose wife will she be, since the  
seven were married to her?

Luke 20:34

Jesus replied, “The people of this age marry and are given in marriage. But those who are considered worthy of taking part in the age to come and in the resurrection from the dead will neither marry nor be given in marriage.”



# Revelations 19:7-8

For the wedding of the  
Lamb has come, and  
his bride has made  
herself ready. Fine linen,  
bright and clean was  
given to her to wear.

## Luke 20:36-38

“And they can no longer die; for they are like the angels. They are God’s children, since they are children of the resurrection. But in the account of the burning bush, even Moses showed that the dead rise, for he calls the Lord ‘the God of Abraham, and the God of Issac, and the God of Jacob.’

He is not a God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive.”

## Romans 5:12

Therefore just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned.

## Romans 5:17-19

For if by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ!

Consequently, just as one trespass resulted in condemnation for all people, so also one righteous act resulted in justification and life for all people. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man that many will be made righteous.
