Vision 2035 Kingdom Building Initiative

1. What is the goal of the Vision 2035 Kingdom Building Initiative?

The goal of the Vision 2035 Kingdom Building Initiative is to raise **\$100,000 over the next five years** to renovate, modernize, and strengthen key areas of our worship campus and ministry facilities. While this is a significant undertaking, we believe it is both achievable and God-ordained as we unite together in faith, prayer, and generosity.

This initiative represents an investment in the future of our church, ensuring that New Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church continues to serve as a place of worship, discipleship, fellowship, and community impact for generations to come.

2. How will the campaign funds be used?

Kingdom Building Initiative funds will be used to renovate and improve several critical areas throughout our church campus, including:

- Worship Center stage and platform upgrades
- New carpet and flooring improvements
- Updated seating and furnishings
- AVL enhancements (Audio, Video, and Lighting systems)
- Fellowship Hall renovations
- Bathroom upgrades
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These improvements are designed to create a welcoming, safe, functional, and inspiring environment that reflects the excellence of our ministry and supports the needs of a thriving, multi-generational congregation.

3. Why are these improvements necessary?

For many years, our Worship Center has been a place where lives have been transformed through worship, prayer, teaching, and fellowship. However, many areas of our campus have not undergone significant renovation in more than 20 years.

As faithful stewards of God's house, we believe it is important to maintain and enhance our facilities in a manner that honors God and effectively serves both our congregation and community. These updates will help ensure that our church remains a welcoming, engaging, and ministry-focused environment for future generations.

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Participation begins with prayer. We ask every member and supporter to pray for wisdom, provision, unity, and God's continued guidance throughout this campaign journey.

We also encourage each person to prayerfully consider how God may be leading them to give sacrificially toward this vision. Every contribution — regardless of size — plays an important role in helping us accomplish the mission before us.

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We ask that you seek God concerning a special sacrificial offering above and beyond your regular tithe and giving.

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In 2026, we will celebrate a special **Pledge Sunday** dedicated to the Vision 2035 Kingdom Building Initiative. During this service, members and supporters will have the opportunity to participate in two meaningful ways:

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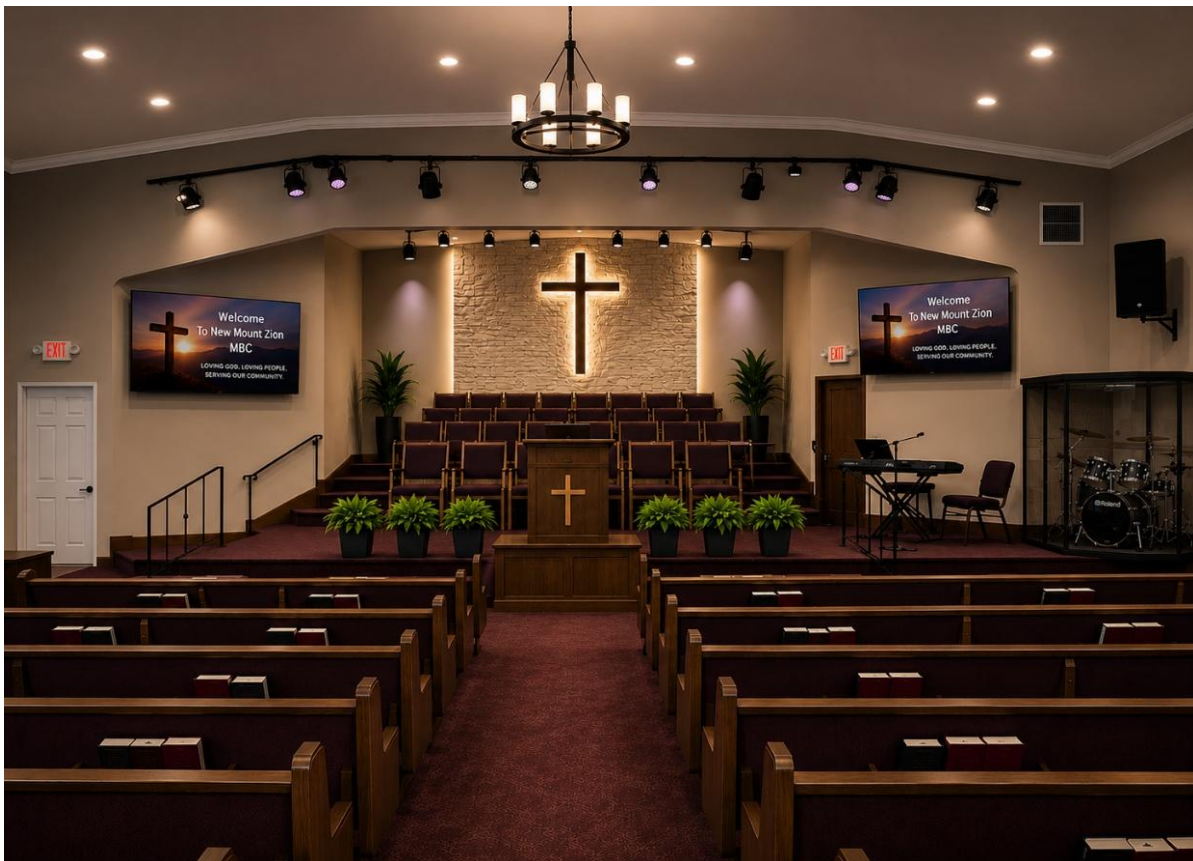
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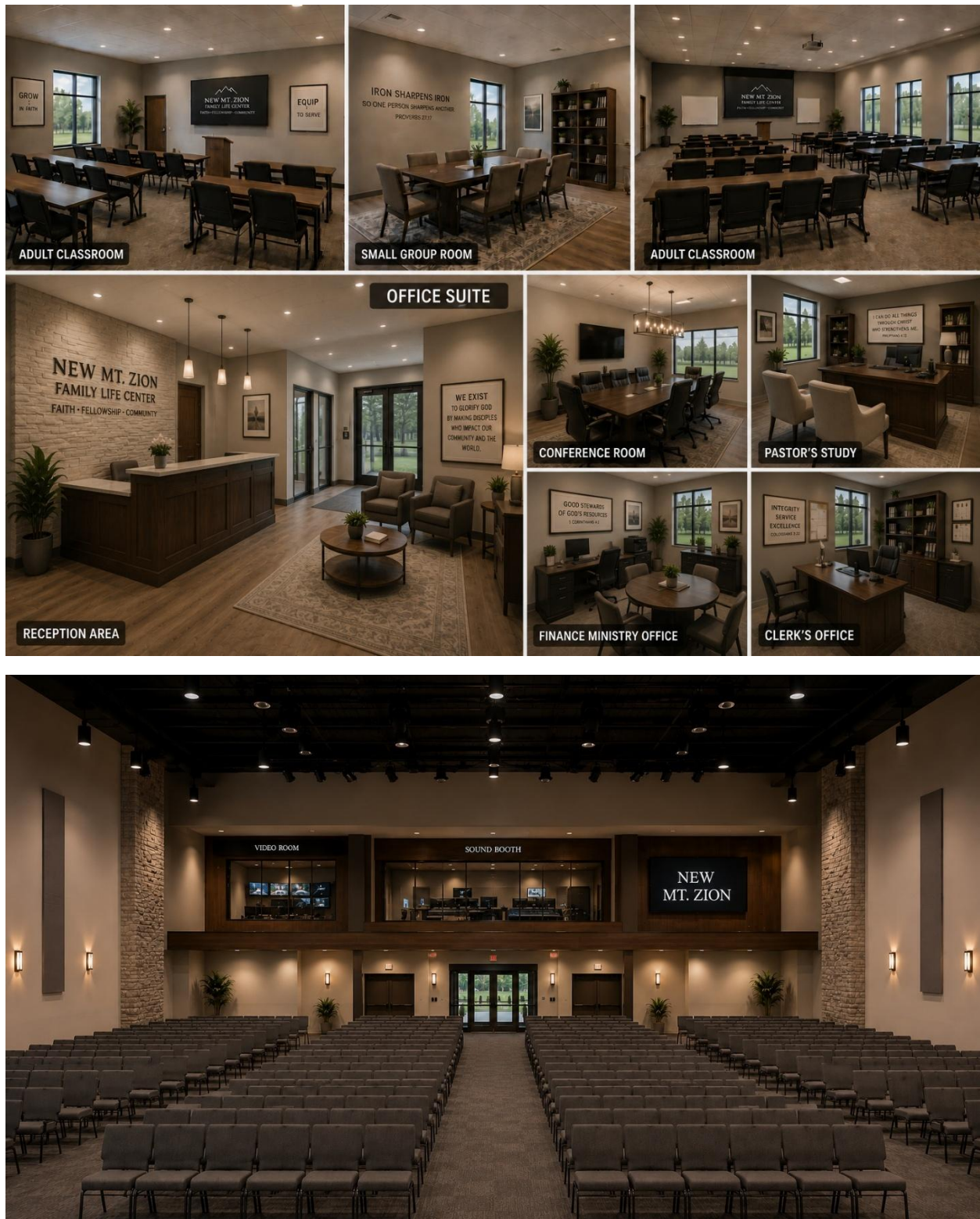
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
