Maple Roasted Sweet Potatoes

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 lbs sweet potatoes, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon



- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper or foil. Grease with nonstick cooking spray.
- 2.Drizzle sweet potatoes with olive oil and toss until well coated. Make sure the sweet potatoes are in a single layer, not touching. Sprinkle with salt.
- 3. Place the pan in the oven and roast for 20 minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, stir together the pure maple syrup and cinnamon in a small bowl.
- 5. Remove the pan from the oven and drizzle the maple cinnamon mixture over the sweet potatoes. Stir until sweet potatoes are well coated. Make sure the sweet potatoes are in an even layer on the pan.
- 6. Return to oven and bake for 10 to 20 minutes, depending on how crispy you like your sweet potatoes.
- 7. Remove the pan from the oven and place sweet potatoes in a serving bowl. Serve immediately.







Italian Sausage Kale Soup

INGREDIENTS:

- Italian Sausage
- 1 large onion
- fresh fennel (or fennel seeds)
- 2 large potatoes
- · head of garlic
- fresh kale (to taste)
- 1 qt chicken broth
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 2 cans of white beans (cannelloni beans)



- 1. Remove the Italian sausage from its casing.
- 2.In a large stockpot, cook the sausage and one large chopped onion in a few tablespoons of olive oil.
- 3. Once the sausage is no longer pink and the onions are transparent, add several toes of garlic (or the whole head if you want), 3 tsp of fennel seeds, and salt and pepper to taste. Cook for a few minutes. Don't burn the garlic.
- 4. Peel 2 potatoes, chop them into cubes, and add to the pot.
- 5. Add a can of cannelloni beans (with its liquid) and 3 cups of stock.
- 6. Stir in some kale (It is up to you how much you want).
- 7. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer covered until the kale is tender (about 15-20 minutes).
- 8. Serve with garlic bread or toasted crostini.





Summer Main Dish

Stuffed Peppers

INGREDIENTS:

- 3-6 red, yellow, orange, and/or green peppers (cut in half & seeded)
- medium onion, chopped
- 4-5 garlic toes (minced)
- bunch of green onions
- 2 lb. ground beef
- Italian bread crumbs
- grated parmensen cheese
- salt & pepper



- 1. Cut 6 or so bell peppers in half. Remove the seeds.
- 2. Chopped 1 green pepper, 1 onion, and a few toes of garlic.
- 3. Brown a pound (or two) of ground beef.
- 4.Add chopped onion and pepper. Sauté until translucent.
- 5.Add chopped garlic and cook for a few minutes. Do not burn the garlic.
- 6.Remove from heat. Add a cup or so of Italian bread crumbs. You want it to have a stuffing consistency.
- 7. Stir in 1/2 cup of grated Parmesan cheese. If the stuffing is too dry, drizzle some olive oil to moisten it.
- 8. Spoon the meat stuffing into each bell pepper half. Fill completely. Sprinkle more parmesan cheese on top of each one.
- 9. Place them side by side in a large rectangular baking dish. Add a little water to the dish. Make sure the water doesn't get into the pepper and its stuffing.
- 10. Cover and bake at 350 for 30 minutes (or until the peppers are soft.)







Chilled Mason Jar Pasta Salad

INGREDIENTS:

- Cooked pasta (I use Tri-Color Rotini)
- Olive oil and balsamic vinegar
- Salt & pepper to taste
- Fresh basil, oregano, Italian parsley, and thyme (loosely chopped)
- 1 cup of chopped Bell peppers (mixture of green, red, and orange if possible)
- 1/2 cup of chopped Green onions or chives
- Several Cherry Tomatoes (cut in half)
- Chopped marinated artichoke hearts and sliced black olives
- Favorite cheese
- Mason jars with lids



- 1.At the bottom of the mason jar, add olive oil, vinegar, fresh herbs, and seasoning.
- 2. Whisk together.
- 3.Add veggies, olives, and artichoke hearts.
- 4. Then pour in cooked pasta till the jar is full.
- 5.Add some cheese, cover, and refrigerate.
- 6. When a child needs a snack or you want a cool lunch for beach days, remove the jar, shake it, and dump it on a plate.





Anytime Snacks

Hummus

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (15-ounce) can chickpeas
- 1 large lemon
- 1/4 cup well-stirred tahini
- 1 small garlic clove, minced
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for serving
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- Salt to taste
- 2 to 3 tablespoons water or aquafaba (liquid from chickpea can)
- Dash ground paprika for serving



- 1.In the bowl of a food processor, combine the tahini and lemon juice and process for 1 minute. Whip or "cream" the tahini to make the hummus smooth and creamy.
- 2.Add the olive oil, minced garlic, cumin, and a 1/2 teaspoon of salt to the whipped tahini and lemon juice. Process for 1 minute.
- 3. Open, drain, and rinse the chickpeas. Add half of the chickpeas to the food processor and process for 1 minute. Scrape sides and bottom of the bowl, then add remaining chickpeas and process until thick and quite smooth; 1 to 2 minutes.
- 4. Taste for salt and adjust as needed. Serve hummus with a drizzle of olive oil and dash of paprika.





Golden Cinnimon Milk

INGREDIENTS: Golden Spice Mix

- 3 tablespoons ground turmeric
- 11/2 tablespoons ground ginger (2 Tbsp for spicier)
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 11/2 teaspoons ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 to 1 1/2 teaspoons ground black pepper

INGREDIENTS: Golden Milk

- 2 cups of favorite plant-based milk
- 4 teaspoons maple syrup
- 1 tablespoon golden milk spice mix
- extra cinnamon to sprinkle on top.



- 1. Add all of the spices to a jar and shake vigorously until well-mixed.
- 2. Add 1 tablespoon of the spice mix to a small pot, with 2 cups of milk and maple syrup. Whisk very well and turn the heat to medium-low.
- 3. Heat milk till it starts to form bubbles along the edges. Whisk continuously for 3-4 minutes until heated. Do not let it boil! The milk will look brown in the beginning but after it thoroughly heats through, all that turmeric will turn it a beautiful golden color.
- 4. Pour in mugs and serve immediately! Add sweetener if you want.





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
