Language Arts

- 1. Read Christmas picture books aloud as a family.
- 2. Listen to Christmas novels on audible.
- 3. Read different versions of "The Night Before Christmas."
- 4. Memorize famous Christmas poems or Bible verses.
- 5. Make & write Christmas Cards. Address envelopes and mail.
- 6. Make a gift list for friends and family.
- 7. Write grocery lists for shopping, baking, and cooking.
- 8. Write recipe cards and give to neighbors with homemade cookies.
- 9. Read and sing Christmas Carols.
- 10. Read, tell, and make up Christmas Dad jokes.
- 11. Do <u>Christmas Mad Libs</u>.
- 12. Play <u>Christmas Version</u> of Taco, Goat, Cat, Cheese, Pizza game: Santa Cookie Elf Candy Snowman
- 13. Play Christmas Scattegories.
- 14. Respond to Christmas Writing Prompts in notebook. (Describe your favorite Christmas tradition, Pretend you are a Christmas Tree and describe your day, Create an Acrostic Poem about Christmas, What would be the perfect gift?, etc.)

Math

- 15. Go Christmas shopping. Use coupons and stay in a budget.
- Go grocery shopping for Christmas meals and baking.
 Do some comparison shopping.
- 17. Follow recipes. Double and triple recipes.
- 18. Measure ingredients and bake Christmas cookies and holiday meals.
- 19. Play lots of dice and card math games. Play lots of board games!
- 20. Sing the "12 Days of Christmas" carol. Then calculate how <u>many gifts</u>
 <u>True Love received on the 12th Day</u>. Lots of patterns.

Math

- 21. Make string art for gifts: star, Christmas Tree, & snowflake.
- 22. With Legos, build a nativity set, a Christmas Tree, or sets
- 23. Construct a gingerbread house.

Science

- 24. Bake and cook. The kitchen is a science lab.
- 25. Observe the weather.
- 26. Experiment and play with snow.
- 27. Make Christmas slime. Make, play with, and give as gifts.
- 28. Go Christmas Tree shopping. Notice the different kinds of evergreen trees.
- 29. Decorate an outside tree in your yard. String fresh orange slices and cranberries for garland. Make homemade bird feeder ornaments with peanut butter, bagels, and bird seeds.
- 30. Observe and draw the birds and animals that visit your tree.
- 31. Walk in your neighborhood and search for poinsettias. Learn about them. Draw them.

- 32. Listen to The Messiah by Handel. Learn the songs. Learn about Handel. Go to a community concert of The Messiah.
- 33. Sing and memorize Christmas songs.
- 34. Do hymn studies as you sing and learn Christmas carols.
- 35. Listen to The Nutcracker. See a live performance. Learn about Tchaikovsky. Read The Nutcracker picture books.
- 36. Knit, crochet, or felt. Make Christmas crafts and give as gifts.
- 37. Paint and watercolor winter scenes and Christmas themes.
- 38. Learn to play simple Christmas carols with a musical instrument.
- 39. Practice handwriting by making homemade cards & gift tags.
- 40. Learn how Christmas is celebrated in other countries.
