TEA PARTY RECIPES



Yogurt Dip or Spread

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup vanilla yogurt
- 2 tbsp of honey or syrup
- 1 tsp of vanilla

DIRECTIONS:

Cinnamon Toast

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 1/2 cup of sugar
- 1/2 cup of cinnamon
- butter and bread

DIRECTIONS:

1. Mix the sugar and cinnamon together.
2. Spread butter on warm toasted bread.
3. Sprinkle cinnamon sugar on top. Cut the ends off and use a cookie cutter to create theme shaped snacks.

TOPIC OR TITLE:

1 WORD TITLE

NOUN - Subject of
the poem

2 ADJECTIVES

Describe the topic
of the poem

3 -ING VERB

Participles that describe
what the poem

2 ADJECTIVES

2 different describing
words

1 SYNONYM

Another Noun that tells
what the poem is about.

RENAME the topic

**Limericks are nonsense poems with lots of puns and punch lines.
It is a five line poem with a A, A, B, B, A rhyme scheme**

8 Syllables

8 Syllables

3RD LINE

5 Syllables

4TH LINE

5 Syllables

5TH LINE

8 Syllables



Tea Time Poetry

COUPLET PATTERN



A Couplet is two lines of poetry with each line ending with a rhyming word.

TOPIC: DOGS

1ST LINE

Line ending with "day"

2ND LINE

Line ending with "say"

CREATE YOUR OWN

TOPIC OR TITLE:

1ST LINE

2ND LINE

Line ends with a word that rhymes with the last word in 1st line.

ACROSTIC PATTERN



Acrostic Poems are written vertically and contain adjectives or words that describe the topic that begin with each letter in the name or topic.

TOPIC OR TITLE:

1ST LETTER OF NAME

NOUN or WORD that starts with this letter

2ND LETTER OF NAME

NOUN or WORD that starts with this letter

3RD LETTER OF NAME

NOUN or WORD that starts with this letter

NEXT LETTER OF NAME

ETC...

NOUN or WORD that starts with this letter

LAST LETTER OF NAME

NOUN or WORD that starts with this letter
