DID YOU KNOW?

Body safety information for young children

Children should know the difference between "okay" and "not okay" or "good" and "bad" touches – touches that are welcome and comforting, and those that are intrusive, unwanted, painful, or uncomfortable. Children should know that they have the right to say "no" to being touched, even to adults, and that no children or adults should touch their private parts unless in very specific circumstances, and for a healthy purpose. This is where it can be helpful to discuss "safe adults," like doctors, who check our bodies to help keep us healthy, and only in the presence of a parent or trusted adult. Información sobre seguridad corporal para niños pequeños

Los niños deben conocer la diferencia entre tacto bueno y tacto malo – los tactos bienvenidos y reconfortantes contra los que son intrusivos, no deseadas, dolorosas y/o incómodas. Los niños deben saber que tienen el derecho de decir "no" a cualquier tipo de contacto no deseado incluso a los adultos, y que ningún niño o adulto deben tocar las partes íntimas salvo en circunstancias muy concretas y con fines sanitarios o médicos. Puede ser útil hablar de "adultos de confianza", como los doctores que revisan nuestros cuerpos para ayudar a mantenernos sanos, y sólo en presencia de un padre o un adulto de confianza. Dear St. Pancratius Family,

As we honor our Father's this Father's Day, I thought I would share some excerpts from our late Holy Father Pope Francis. He wrote an Apostolic Letter called *Patris Corde* (With a Father's Heart). In this letter, he talks a lot about the kind of father St. Joseph was. After all, St. Joseph was the earthly adoptive father of Jesus Christ. He is a great model of Fatherhood. The following quotes all come from *Patris Corde* 7:

- "Fathers are not born, but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person."
- "Being a father entails introducing children to life and reality. Not holding them back, being overprotective or possessive, but rather making them capable of deciding for themselves, enjoying freedom and exploring new possibilities. Perhaps for this reason, Joseph is traditionally called a "most chaste" father...Chastity is freedom from possessiveness...Only when love is chaste, is it truly love."
- "In every exercise of our fatherhood, we should always keep in mind that it has nothing to do with possession, but is rather a "sign" pointing to a greater fatherhood. In a way, we are all like Joseph: a shadow of the heavenly Father."

There are a lot more quotes I can share. I chose these because, in summary, they communicate three things. First, a father can be anyone who assumes the responsibility of caring for another. We have biological fathers, but we also have foster fathers, adoptive fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, and spiritual fathers. Second, children are not possessions of any earthly father. Rather, they are gifts given by the Heavenly Father. Third, the love of a father is meant to be a reflection of the love of our Heavenly Father. A father must always remember that he is first a son of the Heavenly Father and strive to love his own children as the Father loves him.

Querida Familia de San Pancracio,

Al honrar a nuestros Padres en este Día del Padre, pensé en compartir algunos extractos de nuestro difunto Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco. Escribió una Carta Apostólica titulada *Patris Corde* (Con Corazón de Padre). En esta carta, habla mucho el tipo de padre que fue San José. San José fue el padre adoptivo terrenal de Jesucristo. Es un gran modelo de paternidad. Las siguientes citas provienen de *Patris Corde* 7:

- "Los padres no nacen, se hacen. Un hombre no se convierte en padre simplemente por traer un hijo al mundo, sino por asumir la responsabilidad de cuidarlo. Cuando un hombre acepta la responsabilidad de la vida de otra persona, de alguna manera se convierte en padre para esa persona".
- "Ser padre implica introducir a los hijos a la vida y la realidad. No reprimirlos, ni ser sobreprotectores ni posesivos, sino capacitarlos para decidir por sí mismos, disfrutar de la libertad y explorar nuevas posibilidades. Quizás por eso, a José se le llama tradicionalmente un padre "castísimo"... La castidad es liberarse de la posesividad... Solo cuando el amor es casto, es verdaderamente amor."
- "En cada ejercicio de nuestra paternidad, debemos tener siempre presente que no tiene nada que ver con la posesión, sino que es una "señal" que apunta a una paternidad mayor. En cierto modo, todos somos como José: una sombra del Padre celestial."

Hay muchas citas más que podría compartir. Las elegí porque, en resumen, transmiten tres cosas. Primero, un padre puede ser cualquiera que asuma la responsabilidad de cuidar a otra persona. Tenemos padres biológicos, pero también tenemos padres adoptivos, abuelos, padrinos y padres espirituales. Segundo, los hijos no son posesiones de ningún padre terrenal. Más bien, son dones del Padre Celestial. En tercer lugar, el amor de un padre debe ser un reflejo del amor de nuestro Padre Celestial. Un padre debe recordar siempre que es, ante todo, hijo del Padre Celestial y esforzarse por amar a sus propios hijos como el Padre lo ama a él.



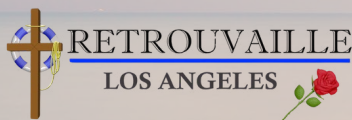
