Dear St. Pancratius Family,

As we transition from the joyful celebrations of Christmas and the Baptism of the Lord, we now enter **Ordinary Time**—a sacred season that invites us to journey with Christ through the rhythms of everyday life. Far from being "ordinary" in the sense of mundane, this period numbers its weeks to honor the fullness of Christ's mystery, allowing us to contemplate his public ministry, teachings, and miracles in a semi-continuous way through the Sunday Gospels. Beginning on the Monday after the Sunday following January 6, it runs until Lent, resumes after Pentecost, and concludes before Advent.

The Church's liturgical wisdom reminds us that Ordinary Time sanctifies the "thirty-three or thirty-four weeks" where no particular mystery dominates, but Christ himself is celebrated in his entirety—especially on Sundays. Unlike Advent or Lent, there is no overarching theme imposed on each Sunday; instead, the readings unfold naturally: Gospel passages from Matthew, Mark, or Luke in sequence, harmonized with Old Testament texts. This structure echoes Vatican II's call to open "the treasures of the Bible more lavishly," drawing us deeper into the Paschal Mystery present in every Eucharist.

Ordinary Time calls us to **sanctify the ordinary**: family meals, work commutes, quiet evenings. As Pope John Paul II taught, the liturgy "gives a rhythm to Christian life and to sanctify time," extending from Sunday Mass into personal prayer and service. Attend weekday Masses when possible, where any of the 34 Ordinary Time formularies may be used pastorally; pray the Liturgy of the Hours to echo this rhythm. Let Christ's healing touch transform your habits of sin into testimonies of grace.

This season, commit to one small step: a daily Gospel reading, acts of mercy, or joining a parish study.

Querida familia de San Pancracio,

Al pasar de las alegres celebraciones de la Navidad y el Bautismo del Señor, entramos a el **Tiempo Ordinario**, un tiempo sagrado que nos invita a caminar con Cristo a través del ritmo de la vida cotidiana. Lejos de ser "ordinario" en el sentido mundano, este tiempo cuenta sus semanas para honrar la plenitud del misterio de Cristo, permitiéndonos contemplar su ministerio público, sus enseñanzas y sus milagros de forma continua a través de los Evangelios dominicales. El Tiempo Ordinario comienza el lunes siguiente al domingo posterior al 6 de enero, se extiende hasta la Cuaresma, se reanuda después de Pentecostés y concluye antes del Adviento.

La sabiduría litúrgica de la Iglesia nos recuerda que el Tiempo Ordinario santifica las "treinta y tres o treinta y cuatro semanas" en las que ningún misterio particular predomina, sino que se celebra a Cristo mismo en su totalidad, especialmente los domingos. A diferencia del Adviento o la Cuaresma, no hay un tema general que se imponga cada domingo; en cambio, las lecturas se desarrollan de forma natural: pasajes del Evangelio de Mateo, Marcos o Lucas en secuencia, armonizados con textos del Antiguo Testamento. Esta estructura refleja el llamado del Concilio Vaticano II a abrir "los tesoros de la Biblia con mayor generosidad", acercándonos más al Misterio Pascual presente en cada Eucaristía.

El Tiempo Ordinario nos llama a **santificar lo ordinario**: las comidas familiares, los trayectos al trabajo, las tardes tranquilas. Como enseñó el Papa Juan Pablo II, la liturgia "da ritmo a la vida cristiana y santifica el tiempo", extendiéndose desde la Misa dominical a la oración personal y al servicio. Asista a Misa entre semana cuando sea posible, donde se pueden utilizar cualquiera de las 34 fórmulas del Tiempo Ordinario; rece la Liturgia de las Horas para hacer eco de este ritmo. Permita que el toque sanador de Cristo transforme sus hábitos de pecado en testimonios de gracia.

En este tiempo, comprométase con un pequeño paso: una lectura diaria del Evangelio, actos de misericordia o unirse a un grupo de estudio parroquial.




