- I. Topic: Kinds of Seams
- II. Objectives:
  - 1. identify the kinds of seam finishes.
  - 2. select the seam appropriate for ladies' casual apparel.
  - 3. value the importance of applying seam in ladies' casual apparel.

#### III. Brief Introduction of the Lesson

Seams are used to attach two separate parts of the garment. The edges of the seams should not be finished so that they will not ravel. Seams should be strong, flat, and inconspicuous. They should have a uniform width. They are usually made on the wrong side of the dress. Seam edges are finished by using one of the following seams finishes.

#### **Kinds of Seam Finishes**

The following seam finishes are commonly used in tailoring:

**Plain seam**. This seam is often used for dresses, collars, linings, blouses, and skirts made from fabric that does not ravel. The two edges of the fabric are simply pinned or basted together and stitched.


**French Seam**. This is used on fabrics on which seam edges would show unattractively. This seam is a seam within a seam.


**Over casted Open Seam**. To prevent ravelling in dress fabrics such as rayon and silk, the seam should be overcast either with both edges together and separately.


**Zigzag open seam**. When only a zigzagger is available, this seam finish for the open seam is used. However, edges are over-edged when there is an over the edging machine.

**Pinked finish.** Use pinking shears on the seam's edges. This gives a neat finish, but it should be used only on firm, closely woven fabrics which are not transparent.

**Edge turned and stitched seam.** This is heavier finish than overcasting and pinking seam finishes. This finish is suitable for lightweight fabrics. To make this finish, trim the seams and turn under raw edges. Machine stitch or make running stitches on the edges.









**Blanket stitch finish**. This can be used instead of overcasting. The blanket stitch the finish is more attractive and more suitable to loosely woven fabrics.




