I. Topic: Examining Biases (for or against) Made by the Author

II. Objectives:

- 1. Identify words/phrases that show bias in a text.
- 2. Distinguish a fact from an opinion in a text.
- 3. Determine the stand/issue of the author/writer in a reading material.

III. Brief Description of the Lesson

Bias is a subjective way of thinking that tells only one side of a story, sometimes leading to inaccurate information or false impression. In the same manner, it refers to words or phrases that are considered prejudiced, offensive, and hurtful. These include expressions that degrade or exclude people due to age, gender, race, ethnicity, social class, or physical or mental traits.

Bias is everywhere. There is bias if the speaker/ writer wants you to believe what he or she is saying. In recognizing bias, watch out for loaded words, words that are charged with emotion, (either positive or negative) can show an author's opinion about his/her topic. Another, look for stereotypes, if the author labels the entire group, the statement is likely biased. Notice also for the vague language or generalizations, if the author is not utilizing specific language, this shows bias, too. One reason why it is so important for the students to learn to differentiate between fact and opinion is that this ability is a stepping stone to detect bias in a text.
