Most of the time, it intently appeals to our emotion rather than to our reason, thus, our decision and judgment are affected. There are several propaganda techniques like **bandwagon**, **glittering generalities**, **testimonial**, **card stacking**, **transfer**, **repetition**, **and plain folks**.
