Message from the Chair!

As we enter 2022 with hope and anticipation, we remember the accomplishments of 2021 and all that we have shared this past year. In spite of the restrictions covid imposed and the new challenging ways in which we learned to gather, the arts flourished in ways we did not know were possible, engaging over 4000 people this past year.

From Zoom, to YouTube, to safe live productions, the Center for the Arts was able to bring a full array of exhibits, performances, and events to our community and into our schools. And for this, the Center for the Arts was honored to be named “Nonprofit of the Year” by the Lake Sunapee Region Chamber of Commerce.

Collaborating with arts organizations and creative individuals in our region, and with the help and energy of our dedicated volunteers, 2021 saw uplifting and beautiful performances of dance and theater, inspiring speakers of poetry and culture, new printed and video productions, and remarkable displays of artwork.

From our new home at the New London Inn, we expanded exhibiting opportunities to artists, offered new programs and services to our members and arts education opportunities to students in our region.

We once again hosted two successful summer arts shows, published a collection poetry, awarded student scholarships, and provided teacher grants bringing Native American Culture Bearers, the Portsmouth Brass Quintet, the Labyrinth Project and the Covid Memorial Flag Project to our schools and to our community.

As an integral partner of the Arts and Business Alliance, we created, printed, and distributed the *Sunapee Region Arts Atlas*, an artfully designed printed resource, and soon to be online interactive map, of all the cultural assets in our region, and we continue to work with others in an effort to broaden, diversify, and make accessible the creative offerings in our region.

With the support of our members, donors, sponsors, and the community at large, we look forward to 2022, with new and exciting events presented both live and virtually, and we welcome the input of others as we plan for the future.

Our communities are filled with creative individuals and we are honored to provide them a platform to showcase their talent, while also being able to serve our residents, visitors, and students throughout the year, with free and low-cost programs. Thank you to all who participated in and supported our many events throughout the year! Together we *“Enrich lives and build community through the Arts!”*



Who We Are

The Center for the Arts is a non-profit organization supporting creative entities and individuals in our midst, bringing the arts to our community for the benefit of our residents and visitors. Believing the arts enhance our quality of life and build a stronger sense of community, we seek to provide opportunities to acknowledge the valuable resources in our region through support of artists and arts organizations, and by showcasing them at events throughout the year. Through our partnerships with existing cultural organizations, artists, writers, performers, schools, and businesses, we strive to provide new arts and education programs while continuing to act as a centralized source of information for regional cultural events. Our ability to offer free and low-cost programs for adults, children, and seniors; opportunities and scholarships to talented students; and grants to teachers for arts enrichment projects ensures we make every effort to broaden, diversify and make accessible informative cultural programs and events in our region.



Free First Fridays in 2021!

In 2021 the CFA hosted twelve free programs on the First Friday of each month, both live and virtually, featuring the New London Barn Playhouse, the Literary Arts Guild Poets, the Visual Arts Guild Artists, Northern Stage Theater, the Kearsarge Conservatory of the Performing Arts, The Mt Kearsarge Indian Museum, The Freese Brothers Big Band, the New London Barn Junior Interns, the Munholland String Quarter, the Lowe Profiles, our Scholarship recipients, and many local artists, musicians, poets and writers creating exciting and unique cultural events for the public.

Other 2021 Projects included:

Visual Arts: Our MicroGalleries at The New London Inn, Bar Harbor Bank and Trust, Blue Loon Bakery, Whipple Hall, and Tatewell Gallery in New London, continue to showcase local and regional artists both virtually and live throughout the year, with rotating exhibits, and exhibit openings, as a part of First Fridays! And in 2022 look for openings at Prospect Hill Art and Antiques in Sunapee too! The Tenth Annual *Arts on the Green*, exhibited the works of juried artists and craftsmen, and the Fourth Annual Show *Naturally New England* show featured the works of over 50 artists, both held in Sunapee Harbor benefitting the CFA and our show partner, Ausbon Sargent Land Trust. In 2022, newly named, *Arts on the Harbor* will take place on July 16th, and *Naturally New England* July 16th-24th.

Literary Arts: The Literary Arts Series “*Beauty is Diversity*”, a collaboration with the Mt Kearsarge Indian Museum, featured virtual speaker events with Poet Laureate Joy Harjo, Native American Poet Carol Dana, and Abenaki Culture Bearers Joseph and Jesse Bruchac, as well as a new publication “*Visual Verse IV*”, a collection of poetry reflecting on Native American culture and artifacts. The theme for 2022 events is “*Farming in New England*”.

Performing Arts: Although the Performing Arts Series was postponed to 2022, we were grateful to be the beneficiary of the SKIT production “*Turning Towards the Sun*” this past Fall and look forward to new performances in 2022 of *Abe and Mary Lincoln*, *St Patrick comes to New London*, and more!

Youth Arts Education: The CFA Scholarship Program provided support to seven local students to pursue their education in the arts, and Teacher Grants were awarded to fund The Covid Memorial Flag Project, and School presentations of the Portsmouth Brass Quintet, Wampanoag CheNulka, and Abenaki

Regional Arts: The CFA continues to send out our free bi-monthly e-Calendar of Cultural Events in the Lake Sunapee Region, keeping over 1800 subscribers informed, and maintains our website of arts resources www.CenterForTheArtsNH.org visited over 10,000 times and social media platforms reaching over 25,000 in 2021.

New in 2022 - Tapestry Tuesdays! We are expanding our programs in 2022 with a “tapestry” of arts events at the New London Inn. Tapestry Tuesdays, will offer a variety of literary, performing and visual arts events in a casual setting, the Third Tuesday each month.

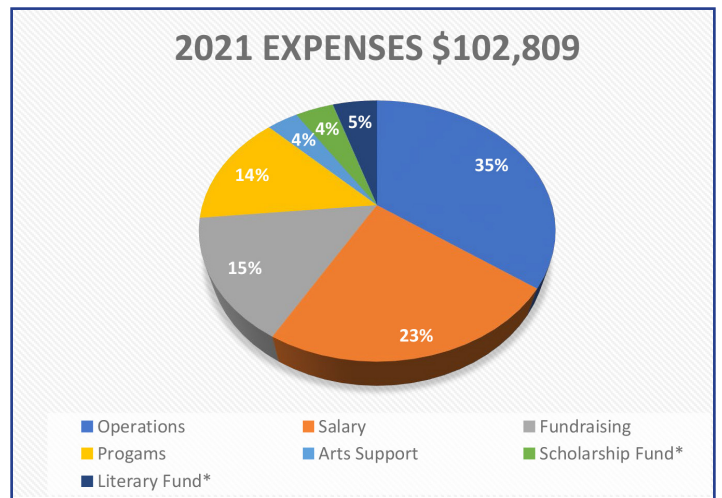
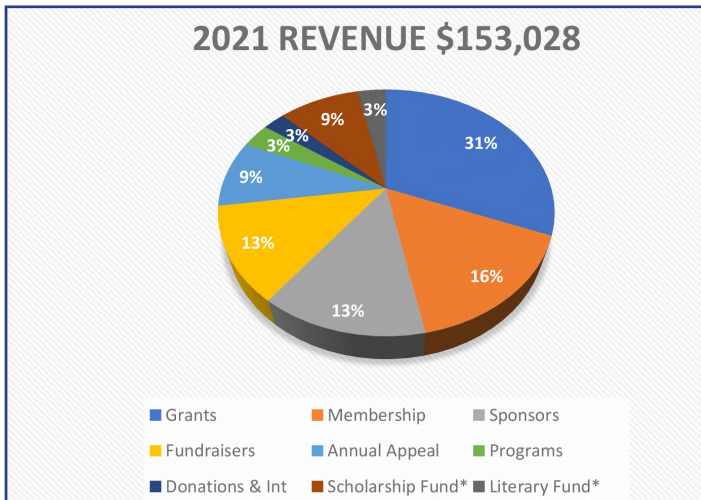
