Not to condemn, but to love

A commentary on John 3: 16-21 by Margaret Silf; New Daylight September-December 2009

or God so loved the world that he gave 🖣 his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life'. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those that believe in him are not condemned: but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God.'

It begins with love, John tells us - God's love for his creation. This is a mind-blowing truth because, for very many people, this is not their experience of human relationships. Very few of us ever experience the power of unconditional love. even the love of parent for child is rarely, if ever, totally unconditional. Here we are told that God's love is poured out unstintingly and unconditionally to the very limits of giving and forgiving.

Love desires to build up the other and bring him or her to fullness of life, but so many human relationships are instead undermined by criticism, judgement, rejection, condemnation. Here we are told that this isn't at all what Jesus



is about. This truth can take a lifetime to assimilate, especially if we have lived with destructive criticism in ouir own relationships.

A child who is given this kind of loving admiration learns to trust. God invites our trust. He invites us to go beyond merely believing facts about him in our head, to trusting him in our heart, with every breath we take. So it is that, in these few verses, John spells out the core of the gospel: God's love enables us to learn to trust first God, then eachj other and ourselves, and trust dispels fear.

Reflection

Where there is love, trust can grow. Where there is trust, fear of the darkness will fade into everlasting light.


