THE MISSING ONE

Commentary on Luke 15:1-7 by Felicia Howell Laboy. Disciplines, in Upper Room, September 2025

In an era in which we're told that we should not pursue perfection but progress, it seems like overkill to risk ninety nine sheep for just one. I mean, the rest could wander off while the shepherd is searching. Worse still, this passage tells us that the shepherd has left them in the wilderness! What about their care? All over just one sheep—ugh!

As a clergy person with more than twenty-four years of ministry, I have found that the single largest hindrance to evangelism is that current members (i.e., the ninety-nine) are often quite concerned about the amount of time a shepherd should dedicate to locate and carry lost sheep home. We expect that "lost sheep" should be able to find their way to church whenever the church gathers. If the ninety-nine know what to do, one should be able to do so as well.

But Jesus and his audience understood sheep better than we do. Instead of crying out, a lost sheep curls up and lies down. It becomes immobilised by fear. For a lost sheep to get back to the fold, it has to be carried. In a similar way, those new to the faith, those who haven't been to church in a while, and those who have been wounded by the church need to be "carried" back into our congregations, usually with more time and attention from not only the pastor (shepherd) but also from those in the church community (the ninety-nine). Adjustments have to be made for the one that haven't been made for the majority because the needs are different.

Jesus is clear. When our righteousness becomes more important than making room for one more to enter the kin-dom of God, our priorities are not in alignment with God's. Further, we are missing out on joy that this world can't give or take away.

God, make us secure enough to join you in seeking and ministering to those who can't cry out and who need just a bit more. Amen
