Waiting A commentary on Matthew 1: 18-20 by Brother Ramon SSF; New Daylight September - December 2000

hen his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."

When I was a little boy, I had a stratagem to make Christmas come less slowly (it works the opposite way now!) I measured a novena (9 days) back from the early hours of Christmas morning and then counted down each day: "Nine days and nine nights - Christmas!" The pain was taken out of waiting - or seemed to be.

No such boyhood stratagem could help Joseph, for he was caught up in a dilemma of aprehension and anticipation in which hope and trust were mingled with fear. Can you imagine the widening of his eyes, the race-beat of his heart, the cold clamminess of his skin as he looked, listened, and took Mary's hand in his own when she told him of the visit of Gabriel. How could he believe such a thing - but how could he distrust her? It was a matter of believing where you could not see, of trusting where you could not prove, and the whole of his life was in her hands now.

There is such a straight forward beauty about the account and such a ring of truth which shines through Mary's belief in Joseph as he wakes from the communicative truth of his dream, acting with integrity and quiet faith. This is the point at which the Gospel summons us to enter into the beauty of obedience and trust as we wait for his yearly miracle of grace which takes place in the celebration of the.

Though Christ a thousand times In Bethlehem be born -Be he not born in thee Thy soul is all forlorn

So wrote the fourteenth - century German mystic Angelus Selesius, and we are on the brink of such a new birth. And we are waiting!

I think too little of Joseph, Lord, but let those marvellous inward virtues of waiting, aprehension and anticipation shine in my heart at this brink of Incarnation - and let the light spread!
