## Even more...or less ?

*A commentary on Mark 8: 31-34 by David Spriggs; New Daylight May - August 2006*

**J**esus began telling his disciples what would happen to him. He said, 'The nation's leaders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the Law of Moses will make the Son of Man suffer terribly. He will be rejected and killed, but three days later he will rise to life.'... Peter took Jesus aside and told him to stop talking like that. But when Jesus turned and saw the disciples he corrected Peter. He said to him, 'Satan, get away from me! You are thinking like everyone else and not like God.' Jesus then told the crowd and the disciples... 'If any of you want to be my followers, you must forget about yourself. You must take up your cross and follow me.'



So maybe the disciples were ready to face the deeper and far more disturbing truth about what being Messiah (and being associated with the Messiah) really meant. Jesus gives the first lesson here.

What a tough lesson it is! Jesus would challenge them on many occasions and in different contexts with this reality-but they still didn't get it. James and John still wanted the best seats in the kingdom (Mark 10: 35-40). Even at the last supper, the disciples were debating which of them was the most important (Luke 22: 24). Unbelievable? Unfortunately not. Listen to (or recognise the motivations lying behind) the discussions of members or leaders of our churches nationally or even our own hearts. Self - seeking and self - protection are insistent voices that are not easily silenced.

When Jesus begins to explain that his model Messiah is the suffering servant, not even Peter can make the leap of faith and faithfulness that is required. Peter tries to be tactful. He takes Jesus aside to put him right, but not even private conversations and prayer can change this fact. The stubborn truth is that God's ways are not like ours. His purposes are to forgive enemies and to restore us to friendship, not quash human rebellion out of existence. The only way to do this is the dreadful way of the cross. The only way to resurrection and restoration is via death.

### Prayer

*Lord Jesus, thank you that you were prepared to pay the ultimate price to restore us to God. Help us to love when we're rejected, forgive when we're hurt and give when we're taken for granted. Amen.*
