


Who is welcome?

Commentary on Luke 15: 1-5 by Andrea Skevington New Daylight May to August 2022

ow all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninetynine in the wilderness and go after the one that he had lost until he finds it? When he has found it he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices.'

Jesus welcomed sinners-so the religious leaders complained. Jesus ate in all kinds of company, unconcerned for his reputation. His goodness took no pride in piety. He spent time with people most religious folk avoid. I have been seeking to change my own behaviour in the light of this. Increasingly, I see the Spirit working in a wider community, moving people to care for each other and creation. During the pandemic, our town has worked to share food in a kind of distributed kingdom feast.

Jesus challenges the religious leaders. Shepherds bring home lost sheep without condemning them. God values the lost, the rejected and the wanderers. Sometimes it seems that religious institutions do not. Jesus does not reject sinners:



he welcomes them. He eats with them. God does not reject us but finds us and brings us home rejoicing. God trusts the righteous, leaves them and goes out of his way to seek the strays. You can't be a good shepherd without getting dirty, without risking thorns and wilderness, without long searching. Jesus led this hard life of a shepherd for our sakes.

So where are we in the story? It is easy to start as lost sheep, but gradually shift to be those who keep apart from others.
