PSALM 23 WEEK 4

Commentary on Psalm 23 by Claudio Carvalhaes in Upper Room Disciplines, April, 2024

On our last week reading Psalm 23, the words that come to me are "God leads me in right paths for God's name's sake." This is a continuation of the "Lord is my shepherd." The shepherd always chooses the best paths to take his sheep and teaches them where to go, how to go, and what to be careful of. In Christian language, this is a parable for discipleship, the art of learning how to live with God and from God. In our journey with Jesus we learn where to go, what to avoid, how to orient ourselves, and with whom we should be. The paths the shepherd leads us on are oriented by God's name-We cannot forget that God's namesake is love! (See I John 4:8). Love is what orients our lives. To learn to love is to learn the wisdom of life. Love is the art of being free.

It was St. Augustine who said, "Love God and do whatever you please: for the soul trained in love to God will do nothing to offend the One who is Beloved. "Isn't this beautiful? With love as the

core of our being, we cannot help but act in ways that spread God's love throughout the world. Jesus reminded us that it is by our fruits



that will be known (see Matthew 7:20). Our fruits will be our witness.

What paths do you walk? What paths does your church walk? Who are the ones who walk with you? Do they have a heart filled with love and compassion? What is the namesake you carry in your heart? What name are you called, the name that comes before you own name? To be led in the right paths, we need to carry the namesake of God in our lives: the mighty name of love!

God, lead me lin the right paths for your name's sake.. (Repeat three times.) Amen.

A Daily Prayer

Loving Lord God, we cry to you for all who are victims of violence, particularly today for beaten girls and battered women.

For women bashed in their own homes, and for their children who witness the violence; for those trapped in destructive relationships, manipulated and controlled; for the women who hide their bruises and lie about their injuries for fear of the next attack: we cry out to you: bring justice! For young girls given or sold in marriage, and for unwilling brides with no way out; for the rape survivors who live with its scars; for women sold or tricked into the sex trade; for female-children who are unwanted or the first to be aborted and abandoned; for girls denied access to education and the women denied religious freedom: we cry out to you: bring justice! For the women harassed in their workplaces, underpaid or threatened with losing their job; for women in prison, abused and abusing, beset by poverty, mental illness and addictions; for older women, frail in body or mind, fearful of violence, manipulation or neglect: we cry out to you: bring justice! We cry to you, Lord Jesus Christ, for our sisters, our daughters, our mothers, ourselves. Hear us, Lord Jesus Christ, for you know what it is to be stripped and beaten, humiliated, betrayed and shamed. Amen.

THY KINGDOM COME

Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.

Since it began in May 2016, God has grown TKC from a dream of possibility into a movement which unites more than a million Christians in prayer, in nearly 90% of countries worldwide, across 85 different denominations and traditionsso that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Every person, household and church are encouraged to pray during the 11 days in their own way.
