GOD'S AMAZING MERCY

Only when Saul had his literal vision removed was he able to see Jesus as God. And it is God, in the form of Christ who calls Saul here.

"Who are you Lord?" Saul questions. Because Saul is a learned man, he knows what a theophany (an appearance of God on earth); it's assumed that he would have recognised the heavenly voice. And yet he does not respond with the standard, reverent response we hear in later verses from Ananias ("Yes, Lord"). The irony is not lost here, Saul, who claims to be a devout and faithful follower of God the Father, does not offer a faithful response to his theophany, Ananias, a persecuted follower of Jesus, the first bishop of Damascus, and likely a target of the letter Saul requested from the synagogue, does.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," The voice responds to Saul's question. At this moment, it's clear that Saul understands his mistake. And he is silent, Saul realises he has been blinded

literally and spiritually; He does not speak, eat, nor drink for three days. Can you imagine what must have been going through Saul's mind? Does he wonder why he has not been instantly killed by God? Does he wonder if he will regain his sight? We are not privy to Saul's internal dialogue—whether of fear, repentance, or anger.

It is Ananias, a Christian, who is called by God to go to Saul after the three days. Saul, before his conversion, would have had Ananias immediately arrested for believing in Christ. But here, it is Ananias who is chosen to help carry out God's mercy to restore Saul's sight—literally and spiritually. Saul's gift of grace comes from the very target of his persecution: lesus and his followers.

Holy One, teach us the error of our ways. When we arrogantly believe that we have the mind of God, call us to humility. When we hatefully persecute those whom we love, call us to empathy. Jolt us from our sin. Have mercy on us. Amen


