SUSTAINABLE LIFE GIVING WATER

Commentary on Jeremiah 2:13 by Bonface Ghero Wanyama. Disciplines, in Upper Room, August 2025

Jeremiah uses the metaphor of water to show that the people have turned away from God. Water symbolises salvation, life, and blessings. The people are misguided not only by turning from God, the source of living water, but by turning toward other gods that will not provide the care they so desperately need. They have built for themselves sources of water that are not sustainable. They will find no water in broken cisterns.

By naming two evils, "sins", Jeremiah highlights that leaving God and the subsequent attachment to other gods are separate sins, just as the first two commandments—to have no other gods and to not make idols—are two separate transgressions against God (see Exod. 20:3-4). The metaphor of the water is apt in describing the Israelites' covenant-breaking actions. Not only have they turned away from a constantly renewed source of fresh water, they have also turned toward vessels of water that can only hold existing water, indicating the

water will become stagnant and undrinkable. Furthermore, these cisterns are broken, meaning they will not even effectively hold the stagnant water they contain, as what water does exist will seep through the cracks and disappear into the ground.

Our choice to ignore the ways of God, who is the source of all our needs, leaves us vulnerable. Our efforts are fruitless if we do not involve God. And when we stop focusing on God, something else will fill the void. We will shift our focus to other gods that will not provide the provisions we seek. We will attempt to fashion a new way of life for ourselves apart from God. It is only a matter of time before we understand the limits of the broken cisterns we have built for ourselves, and the ways we are left thirsting for more.

I am vulnerable, O God, living in a dry land. Turn me back to you, the fountain of living water, that I may drink deeply and live fully. Amen
