


Winter warmer from Leunig

The crowd joined in the attack against Paul and Silas, and the magistrates ordered them to be stripped and beaten . After they were severly flogged they were thrown into prison and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. On receiving such orders he put them in an inner cell and fastened their feet in stocks.

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God and the other prisoners were listening to them.

Suddenly there was a violent earthquake and the prison doors flew open.....

Stripped, flogged severely, in prison in chains, it could not have been much worse.... Me I would have been in tears fearful, and no doubt crying over my lot and asking God what he thought he was doing.

Paul and Silas provide a great example for us as we navigate these dark days.

They were **praying & singing hymns** and the miraculous happened.

Note the other prisoners were listening to them. We too can be a witness to others in the way we respond to this crisis.

Praying and singing not only releases us, and helps us to find peace and joy, but others too may find their salvation by the way they see that we are living in this difficult time.

Sometimes it is difficult to keep our heads above water and that is where being part of the body of Christ is sooo good.
