She then decided to come back to Uvalde and was a teacher at Batesville before going to the ESC Region 20 to work as a Migrant and Bilingual Education Specialist. After five years of working in San Antonio, Elsa moved back to UCISD and obtained her masters in Administration becoming assistant principal at Uvalde High School, Junior High and later a principal at Batesville.






3. It helps you connect with others. Learning about your family history can have amazing effects on the way you connect with others. It opens up conversations that you never dreamed of having with people you may have never known
