BOARD SPOTLIGHT-GABE GONZALES



Uvalde born and raised, Gabe Gonzales has grown up with a sense of hometown pride especially where Uvalde football is concerned. Attending Uvalde High and graduating in 2002, Gabe speaks of how area football brought such pride to the area and

still does.

After attending high school he spent 4 years in the Marines where he was sent to Okinawa, the Philippines, "Everywhere but Iraq" Gabe said. I felt that something may have happened if I went to Afghanistan. God was protecting me and allowed me to stay out of the war zone. Every time I was supposed to go I was sent somewhere else. Crazy!"

Even though Gabe and his wife Jennifer grew up in Uvalde they did not really meet until later on the social media site My Space when Jennifer was in college. "Our first date was at Applebee's in San Marcos." After getting out of the military he was planning on attending college but plans changed and he followed Jennifer back to Uvalde.

He and Jennifer, who is a educational diagnostician, have two children 10 and 14. His son plays football, which Gabe coaches and his daughter is in color guard where she also participates in competitions. Gabe attended SWTJC and Sul Ross University where he obtained his teaching degree and now teaches 5th grade math at Flores Elementary. He has recently obtained his degree in digital marketing from UT.

His passion is music where he manages the popular band Eztilo who perform all over South Texas. They are hoping to perform here at HHAC in November.

In sharing about growing up in Uvalde, Gabe spoke of the division between Hispanics and Anglos. "Uvalde has improved from when I was younger but we have a way to go. If we would experience how each other lives, we would be a lot better off. We need to learn to tolerate our differences and not be afraid. Otherwise it is going to remain the same. I am doing what I can to help change that mindset." Gabe is proudly HHAC'S first Hispanic male board member.

He was introduced to us by Jennifer's grandmother, Cora Ann Fowler. Serving on our board for 4 years, Gabe is able to bring a different spin to how we operate.

Gabe spoke of what an asset HHAC is to Uvalde but we need to get out of our comfort zone. "We need younger people here to participate and volunteer and to bring new ideas. People from all ages really need to come see what we have to offer and how great HHAC can be."

Two or more must be in the woodshop with a Center representative being one of them.




