BESSIE COLEMAN CENTENNIAL AVIATION FILM FESTIVAL TAKES FLIGHT IN CHICAGO SOUTH SUBURBS ON MAY 2, 2026

A first-of-its-kind aviation film festival celebrates courage, innovation, and the future of flight.

Chicago, IL — December 8, 2025 — The legacy of aviation pioneer Bessie Coleman, the first African American and Native American woman to earn a pilot's license, will soar again with the launch of the Bessie Coleman Centennial Aviation Film Festival, a new national celebration of film, innovation, and flight on Saturday, May 2, 2026.

Founded by the Chicago Southland Chamber of Commerce, the Advance Air Mobility Institute, Vertiport Chicago, Tuskegee Airmen, Bessie Coleman All-Stars, Queen B Productions, AeroStar Avion Institute and Aviatrix Company, the festival honors Coleman's trailblazing spirit while spotlighting the next century of aviation — including electric aircraft, eVTOLs, drones, and sustainable flight technologies.

“Aunt Bessie opened the sky for everyone,” says Gigi Coleman, great-niece of Bessie Coleman and founder of the Bessie Coleman Aviation All-Stars. “This festival carries her legacy into the future — inspiring new generations to see aviation not just as a career, but as a calling.”

The Bessie Coleman Aviation Centennial Film Festival is the first in the nation to combine aviation history with emerging technologies in sustainable flight. The festival will showcase films inspired by Coleman's life, women in aviation, and the innovations shaping the skies of tomorrow. This aviation film festival is the first aviation film festival in the world.

- Gigi Coleman and her Bessie Coleman Aviation All-Stars STEM Education program.
- Week-long sharing of Bessie Coleman original pilot license and other family artifacts at DuSable Museum, Chicago.

The centennial of Bessie Coleman’s death (April 30, 1926) offers a historic moment to reflect on a century of aviation progress — and to envision the next 100 years of inclusive, sustainable flight. The festival aligns Coleman’s pioneering courage with the innovation and environmental awareness driving the future of aviation today.

“Our goal is to connect the fearless spirit of Bessie Coleman with the future of flight — one powered by imagination, sustainability, and equity,” says Musacchio. “Her story reminds us that flight is more than machinery — it’s what’s possible.”
