BURN BAN

WHAT ARE THE RULES OF THE OPEN BURNING BAN?

Don't burn anything from May 1 - September 30.

Some exceptions:

- *Agricultural burning exemption
- **Forestry "prescribed burning" exemption
- · Campfires or barbeques
- Fire-fighting training exemption, provided appropriate permit is issued
- Operation of open flame equipment exemption

Explosive disposal in accordance with U.S. Department of Labor Safety Regulations

CITY OF KINGSTON LIMB POLICY

Tree limbs may not be in excess of five feet in length nor greater than four feet high. No more than two piles are permitted. Limbs will be picked up every two weeks unless there are circumstances that require the pick up times to be adjusted. The limbs must be stacked up neatly and not hanging in the road and must be placed on the edge of the property for pickup. If these requirements are not met, the limbs will NOT be picked up and the resident will be responsible for the disposal of the limbs within 10days. If they are not disposed of within 10 days, the resident may receive a citation for unkempt property. (City Ordinance 14-33)

If your limbs or trees have been cut by a contractor, that contractor is responsible for the removal of the limbs.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

WAYS TO SAVE WATER INDOORS

- · Check all faucets, pipes and toilets for leaks.
- Install water saving showerheads and ultra-lowflush toilets.
- Take shorter showers.
- Never use your toilet as a wastebasket.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Defrost frozen food in the refrigerator.
- Rinse vegetables in a full sink or pan of water.
- Fully load your dishwasher.
- Rinse dishes in a full sink or pan of water.

WASH FULL LOADS OF CLOTHES.

WAYS TO SAVE WATER OUTDOORS

- Don't over-water landscaping.
- Water your lawn or garden early in the morning or late in evening.
- Adjust sprinklers so that they don't water the sidewalk or street.

- Don't water on cool, rainy or windy days.
- Equip all hoses with shut-off nozzles.
- Use drip irrigation systems.
- Plant drought-tolerant or low water-use plants and grasses.
- Use shrubs and ground cover to reduce the amount of grass.
- Place mulch around plants to reduce evaporation and discourage weeds.
- Set your mower blades one notch higher, since longer grass means less evaporation.
- Use a pool cover to cut down on water evaporation.
- Use a bucket instead of a hose to wash your car.

 Use a broom rather than a hose to clean sidewalks,
 driveways, loading docks and parking lots









ANIMAL CONTROL

We do have a leash law within the City and Any dog, while off the property of the owner or upon any private property without the consent of the owner of the property, shall be secured by a leash or chain or sufficient tensile strength to restraint he particular dog or the dog shall be at heal and under the control of its owner.

No owner or custodian of any animal shall fail to exercise proper care and control of such animal to prevent the same from becoming a public nuisance.

Every female dog or cat in heat shall be confined in a building or other enclosure in such a manner that such female dog or cat cannot come into contact with another animal except for planned breeding.

Every owner of a guard or attack dog shall keep such dog confined in a building, compartment or other secure enclosure. Any such enclosure shall be completely surrounded by a fence at least six feet in height and shall be topped with an anti-climbing device constructed of angle metal braces with at least three strands of equally separated barbed wire stretched between them.

All anti-climbing devices shall extend inward at an angle of not less than 45 degrees, nor more than 90 degrees when measured from the perpendicular.

The areas of confinement shall have gates and entrances thereto securely closed and locked, and all fences properly maintained and escapeproof.

Any dog or cat needs to have a valid rabies tag and identifying tag.


Lunches are being served Monday thru Friday at 12:00 p.m. at the Kingston Resource center on Main Street
